### Two more Interpol experts fly in

Two more Interpol experts yesterday joined the three in the capital to help the August 21 grenade blast probe.

Robert M. Thompson, a fire toolmark examiner and Frev J. Bredford, an explosive enforcement officer, both from the US, flew in Dhaka at around 12:00pm to intensify the probe of grenade blasts on Awami League (AL) rally that killed 19 and injured over 200.

Interpol experts Marash Vucilaj, Xin Hu and Jeffery Eyles have been probing the blast in the capital for a week. They sought more hands SEE PAGE 11 COL 2

# Blast rocks Australia embassy in Jakarta

8 killed, 130 hurt, nearby Greek embassy gutted; Qaeda hand blamed

A car bomb has exploded outside the Australian embassy in Jakarta, killing at least eight people and wounding more than 130, in an attack police have blamed on al-Qaeda linked militants.


The blast, which came days ahead of Indonesia's presidential election and exactly a month before Australia's general election, flattened the embassy's gate, mangled cars on the busy commercial street and shattered the windows of nearby high-rise buildings.

Greek foreign ministry spokesman Giergos Koumoutsakos from Athens said the Greek Embassy on the 12th floor of a nearby building

was gutted, and three diplomats were slightly wounded

Dazed survivors desperately tried to locate colleagues and rela-

"I can't find my family," said Suharti, who had eight relatives working in the mission. "I am terrified. I don't know where they are."

## Worry over Rab actions

Another crime suspect killed in 'crossfire'; jurists demand probe into deaths

The elite Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) allegedly killed a crime sus-pect in Hazaribagh yesterday in the latest in a series of 16 such killings that have sent worries across Bangladesh and raised humanrights violations fears.

Rab-2 personnel gunned down Billal Hossain, 28, at his Sher-e-Bangla Road House in Rayerbazar when the elite force unit claimed he opened fire in a brash bid to escape.

Rab personnel, led by Captain Anisur Rahman, hemmed in Billal's house at about 3:00am to seize

illegal arms and sensing the elite force's presence, he opened fire on

"As he tried to break through the cordon shooting with a firearm, Rab men opened fire on him," said a press release from the Rab head-

Billal, son of Meer Box of Ferry Narayanpur in Mymensingh, died instantly taking a hail of bullets in the head and leg about 25 yards off his Friend's Heart hotel in front of the house, rekindling the horror of Clean Heart Operation when 54 people died in alleged torture in

People are now reeling from the fears of Rab torture and death as the force ponders little to take 'deadly actions' on suspicion.

After anyone dies during their operation, Rab men claim they died either in their attempt to flee or in

On the Rab claim, prominent jurist Dr Kamal Hossain said, "The law says minimum force should be applied to arrest anybody. We should see whether the law is applied properly since people are dying during arrest."

### Pakistan kills 50 in Qaeda camp raid

Pakistani forces smashed a suspected al-Qaeda training camp early yesterday in a remote tribal area near the Afghan border, killing some 50 militant fighters, the military

"Around 50 people, 90 percent of them foreigners, were killed in the strike on the terrorist training camp," military spokesman Major General Shaukat Sultan told the private ARYOne television channel.

Most of the victims were Uzbeks and Chechens with some Arabs among them, Sultan said. A military statement said troops

launched "a precise strike on a foreign terrorist training camp... and successfully knocked it out." The camp was located at Dila

Khula district, some 60 kilometers (37 miles) from the border and 25km northeast of Wana, the main city in the tribal district of South

The raid, which lasted around two hours, was based on reports of

training activity by "foreign ele-ments" including Uzbeks, Chechens and some Arabs.

Local residents reported seeing bombs and missiles dropped from fighter planes on a prayer gathering.

People had gathered for morn ing prayers when a missile struck their compound at around 6:30 am (0130 GMT)," resident Azizullah

"It was followed by aerial bombardment resulting in the killing of more than 50 people.'

A security official who asked not be named said only one guided missile was fired at the gathering by ground troops. The area is a stronghold of the

rebellious Mehsud tribe. The latest offensive comes a day after a shootout between militants

and security forces in Wana bazaar, in which eight people were killed.

The military destroyed several suspected al-Qaeda hideouts and training camps in a major air and ground offensive in June in the


