Rahman inaugurated the commission's activities at a simple ceremony at its makeshift office at Bangladesh Civil Service Administration Academy at Shahbadh

Finance Secretary Zakir Ahmed Khan, Pay Commission Chairman Mujibul Huq and members of the commission were present at the function. Since its formation on July

10, the commission carried out preparatory works for two months to gin its operation.

There has to be a harmonisation between our limited resources and expectation of the officials and employees," the minister advised the commission, giving the indication of devising an affordable pay

He, however, suggested the commission to consider the affects of inflation and other related things to prepare the pay structure, which should not be set up chasing the pay structure of private sector like commercial banks.

3 killed in city road accidents

He was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors declared him dead.

10 BRTC buses for women

The state-run Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) yesterday introduced 10 more buses for working women on nine routes in the capital

Communications Minister Barrister Nazmul Huda inaugurated the bus service for women at BRTC's Motijheel bus depot yesterday.

The buses -- nine double-deckers and one single-decker -- will ply from 6:00 to 10:00am and 3:00 to 6:00pm carrying women only. The rest of the time they will transport both male and female passengers giving priority to the latter. The fare along the nine routes will range between Tk 4 and Tk

The nine routes are: Mirpur-1 to Motijheel via Mirpur-10-Asad Gate-Azimpur-Palashi-Gulistan; Mirpur-1 to Motijheel via Mirpur-10-Farmgate-Gulistan; Mohammadpur to Gulistan via Shefali, executive director of Nari Satmasjid Road-Curzon Hall; Mirpur-12 to Uttara via Mirpur-14-Cantonment-Banani; Mirpur-12 to Kamalapur via Taltala-Agargaon-Khejurbagan-Sangsad Bhaban-Science Laboratory-Azimpur-Gulistan;Khilgaon to Gulistan via Taltala; Gulistan to Narayanganj; Tongi to Motijheel via Banani Mohakhali-Magbazar and

It called for integrating disaster risk management into national development process and introduce Disaster Impact Assessment (DIA) and ensure availability of equipment, material and manpower prior to crisis period through effective contingency plans.

The group suggested that flood warning messages should be made user friendly and relevant to local context.

The arrest of a terrorist by Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) from Khulna Speedy Trial Tribunal in presence of its judge and without his prior permission on Tuesday noon has been strongly condemned by the members of District Bar Association.

Some judges and senior officials of Khulna Metropolitan Police (KMP) have termed the Rab action inside the court as most disgraceful. Such an act is tantamount to contempt of court, said President of Khulna District Bar Association Advocate Sohrab Hossain Rab should have sought per-

mission from the judge concerned who was trying a case at the time of the arrest of terrorist Maruf Billah of Rampal upazila under Bagerhat district, he

Officer-in-Charge Mosharaf Hossain and Nazir of District

Judges' Court Motaleb Hossain filed two separate general diaries with Khulna Police Station in this
