## Bengal Studies Conference in city in January

The 37th Bengal Studies Conference (BSC) will be held in Dhaka from January 4 to 6 to help create a potential future for Bangladesh through discovering its past.

This is the first time that the conference is going to be held in Bangladesh in its 40-year history.

Traditionally, the noted universities of the United States and Canada have organised the conference.

The first BSC was held at Michigan State University in the USA in 1965.

It specially focuses on culture, tradition, history, science, technology, political science, international relationship and anthropology of Bangladesh.

Stamford University, Bangladesh, a private university, will host the 37th Bengal Studies Conference.

Stamford University Vice-Chancellor Dr M A Hannan Firoj will act as convenor.

At a press conference at the National Press Club in the city yesterday, Dr Hannan announced the formation of different committees including patron committee, apex committee and organising committee for smooth holding of the conference.

He said it will include seminar, roundtable, open discussion, audio-visual show, book and photo fair, cultural programme, river cruise and city tour.

## 16 ships to arrive at Ctg port this week

Sixteen ships, including a container, are expected to arrive at Chittagong Port in the next one week, port officials said.

The ships, scheduled to arrive here by September 16, include five Bangladesh flag carrier, four Singapore flag carrier and two Vietnam flag carrier vessels.

The port sources said four ships - Kota, Naga, QC Honar, Orchid and Bangla Shourab berthed at the port jetties yesterday while five others - MV Gracia, MV Bangla Jyoti, Bangladesh Robi, Bangla Bijoy and Sonata - sailed out after unloading container and bulk cargoes.

Twelve ships now berthed at the port and the private jetties and now loading and unloading containers and cargoes, the sources said.

## 'Resist repression on women unitedly'

Speakers tell Karmojibi Nari rally

Speakers at a rally in the city yesterday called for building up united resistance against all sorts of repression on women.

They also urged the authorities concerned to take steps to end all kinds of discrimination against women.

The rally was organised by Karmojibi Nari, an initiative for working women, at the Central Shaheed Minar to observe the Day of Resistance to Violence against Women.

The speakers called upon all political parties and progressive forces to forge greater unity against women repression, bomb and grenade attack, terrorism and communalism.

They expressed concern at the August 21 grenade attack on Awami League rally that killed 20 people including AL women leader Ivy Rahman and three other women.

Karmojibi Nari President Shirin Akhtar urged the government to form impartial probe commission to investigate the cases of women repression.

"We cannot depend on police investigations as women are still being raped and tortured in police custody," she added.

"Recently two police were sentenced to death in the verdict of the Yasmin Rape and Murder Case, but women repression is continuing in the country as usual," said Golam

## 75.29 pc wants UZ system

### Survey says

UNB, Dhaka

A nation-wide survey by a Dhaka University teacher found that 75.29 per cent respondents support immediate reintroduction of the upazila system while the lowest 70.40 per cent was from Chittagong division.

Prof Dr Salahuddin Aminuzzaman of Public Administration and Chairman of Development Studies Department conducted the survey among 2250 people of 21 old districts.

Among the respondents, 84.60 per cent of the elected representatives of Union Parishad suggested immediate reintroduction of the upazila system.

Respondents of the survey included students, lawyers, local level political leaders and activists, small business, agricultural workers, farmers, UP elected leaders, school and college teachers.

## Janajuddha man shot dead

An alleged armed cadre of an outlaw outfit was shot dead by miscreants at Juranpur village in Jibonnagar upazila on Thursday night.

Sources said terrorists forcibly brought him out of his residence and took him to a nearby field where they shot and chopped him.

Purbo Bangla Communist Party (M-L) claimed the responsibility for the killing of Rahim.

## COURSE ON JOURNALISM PIB students threaten legal action

Journalism students of the Press Institute of Bangladesh (PIB) yesterday protested the inscription of word 'diploma' instead of 'postgraduate diploma' on their mark sheets and certificates.

The PIB conducts the course 'Postgraduate diploma in journalism' in affiliation with the National University (NU).

At a meeting in the city, the students also threatened to take legal action against the two institutions if they do not correct it.

They said the PIB mentioned the course as postgraduate diploma in the advertisement for admission, question papers and all notices, but the NU issued mark sheets and certificates with the inscription of 'diploma'.

"This is simply a fraud and we will go to court if the authorities do not take corrective measures," said Shawkat Hossain, a 2nd batch student of PIB and editor of the Daily Ajker Bhol.

Such negligence has tainted the image of the institute, said Rafiqul Islam Badal, convenor of the Postgraduate Diploma Course Implementation Committee.
