## Pakistan thrash Kenya uled after rain washed out play on

Pakistan sent out a warning to India before their ICC Champions Trophy Pool C showdown with a sevenwicket demolition of Kenya at Edgbaston on Wednesday.

Shahid Afridi took career-best figures of five for 11 off six overs and off-spinner Shoaib Malik chipped in with three wickets as Kenya were dismissed for just 94.

Yasir Hameed top-scored with 41 and Imran Farhat finished unbeaten on 38 as Pakistan reached their target in the 19th over

The match in Birmingham, which also hosts the India-Pakistan clash on Sunday, had been reschedTuesday.
"I'm not really a wicket-taking

bowler, I'm trying to stop the runs but if you do that then the wickets come,' man-of-the-match Afridisaid. "I was really just trying to bowl

wicket to wicket and I got the results." Pakistan captain Inzamamul Haq won the toss and chose to bowl after

looking at the green-tinged pitch. Kenya suffered a poor start when opener Ravindu Shah hit the second ball he faced straight to Afridi in the covers off Navedul Hasan.

Kennedy Otieno and Maurice Ouma struggled to fend off shortpitched deliveries from fast bowler Shoaib Akhtar but resurrected the innings with a 65-run partnership before rain forced the players off the field for 25 minutes.

Inzamam introduced spin when play resumed, the decision immediately paying off when Ouma (23) was

caught by Moin Khan from a bottom edge off Afridi's second ball.


Otieno (33) was trapped lbw by Malik, before Kenya captain Steve Tikolo, playing for spin, was deceived by a Malik delivery that faded away from the right hander and nicked the top of his off stump for a duck.

The spinning pair went on the rampage with none of the Kenyan batsman able to handle variations in pace from Afridi and sharp turn from Malik as five of the final six batsmen dismissed were bowled.

"We did very well up front with Kennedy and Maurice but lost our way in the middle," said Tikolo. "We lost too many wickets and that was our downfall.

"They bowled well and in the right areas and with the rain coming down, the wicket started skidding a little bit and I think we were put off a SEE PAGE 14 COL 3

About Bangladesh, the experienced cricketer, who has already played 135 ODIs and became the first English bowler to 200 (203) wickets in one-dayers earlier this month, said only having a high-profile coach like Dav Whatmore was not good enough to improve the performance

"You can only improve if you work out your weaknesses yourself. I went to different world famous bowlers to learn the mechanism of the reverse swing, so it is your players' duty to talk to the great cricketers and learn something," he suggested.

Somebody told me how to do it but I am still trying to bring accuracy to my reverse swing even at this late stage of my career," said Gough

Gough was asked why England did not produce too many express

bowlers.

"In English conditions bowlers go for extra pace," explained Gough.

## Sachin may miss 1st Test

Master batsman Sachin Tendulkar

may not be fit in time for India's first Test against Australia, which starts in Bangalore on October 6.

Andrew Leipus, the team's phys-iotherapist, said that it was the worst injury of his career, and also revealed that the tennis elbow had been aggravated when he was hit by

an Ajit Agarkar delivery in Holland. Leipus was, however, cautiously optimistic about Tendulkar's chances of being fit for next month's home Test series against Australia,

saying he expected the injured batsman to pick up a bat "in the next 10 days or so".

He now has only a few weeks to get fit for the first of four Tests against Australia, starting at Bangalore on October 6.

Tendulkar, who is currently undergoing treatment in London for the left elbow injury, has already been excluded by his state team Mumbai for the five-day Irani Cup match between the Ranji Trophy champions and the Rest of India

starting in Mohali on September 22. The only other first-class match before the Test series is the three-day game between a Board President's XI and Australia at Hyderabad com-

mencing September 30.

The Times of India reported Leipus as saying: "Initially, he responded well in the nets in Holland for the first two days and hetted well against the spinners. But batted well against the spinners. But then he faced the first ball from Agarkar which he went back to play down - it kind of complicated his recovery process completely."

The target for Tendulkar, according to Leipus, would be to bat 300 balls a day without experiencing any pain and he added, "We're looking for him to grab a bat again in another ten days' time."



Bangladesh will send a tenmember team including four female players to the meet in Calvia, Mallorca.




"Today, I resigned as coach of the Argentina national team," the intro-verted Bielsa told a news confer-
