Shantha P Gunasekara A pianist par excellence

USIC runs in the blood of the diminutive Shantha, ace pianist and music instructor. She has trained hundreds of children in the piano, taught singing and history of music to students of Green Herald School and nowwants to pursue further studies in music therapy, as well as complete her Ph. D thesis in Ethnomusicology. This relatively less known discipline, in simple words, stands for a study of various types of music in relation to their geographic, musical and cultural context.

To Shantha also goes the credit for opening the Bangladesh centre of the Associated Board of Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM). Prior to its establishment, Shantha would take students to the Kolkata centre of ABRSM between 1991 and 1993. Subsequently, when the number of candidates increased, a similar line of exams was introduced in Dhaka in 1994 for the first time, monitored by the British Council. The following year, the Bangladesh centre of ABRSM was set up with Shantha taking over as the first founder representative (honorary) sponsor for the centre. This organisation celebrates its 10 anniversary. 'I was the first to introduce the systematic examination system of western music in Bangladesh,' asserts

Along side with her piano recitals, Shantha is a committed piano teacher. Though she won plaudits in the 1980s at the Goethe Institut among others, she says that she was keen to go into teaching because she was interested in nurturing new talent. In her words, 'My effort has been to launch at least one pianist in our country, which is better than me being on stage.

Shantha has certainly succeeded in this endeavour. Among the success stories that she cites are those of Swani Zubayer, who learnt music under her from 1997 onwards. Today he is a renowned singer, composer and song writer. Based in Sweden currently, Shantha says that he stands apart from his contemporaries in his 'voice, arrangements, composition and lyrics.' She adds, 'I never tire of listening to his CDs of Bangla music and ghazals.

There's also Emon Shaha, the son of the musician and composer of Bangla music Shatha Shaha. Today he is an upcoming artiste, composer and music director. Says Shantha, 'Emon still comes to take piano lessons and learn music theory with me. His thirst to learn has never ended though he disappears now and then because of his business.

To Shantha also goes the credit for arranging the music and conducting the school choir for the Green Herald school song. The tune was given by Sister Mary Imelda, the ex-headmistress. Another of her unforgettable memories is that of the late 80s when the three-day highly successful Dhaka belongs to a well-known musical family. He was

'Heavy metal music is not my cup of tea,' says Shantha

Music and Art Festival was organised by an enthusiastic expatriate crowd along with renowned local musicians and artistes.

Equally memorable is her return to Sri Lanka in March 2004 when she got a very warm welcome from her 80-year-old former KG teacher.

Shantha's taste in music is eclectic. Her preference runs from the classical music giants of Beethoven, Chopin, Tchaikovsky and Schubert to western music, Rabindra Sangeet and adhunik gaan. 'Heavy

metal music is not mycup oftea, she asserts.

A life without music is unthinkable for Shantha. At the young age of six she learnt the piano and gave exams under the Trinity School of Music, London. Getting flying colours in almost every exam, she sang in Radio Ceylon as a child artiste. In 1976 she gained admission to the State Institute of Culture in St Petersburg in USSR. She did her MA in music and majored in piano. Subsequently she did a year's teacher training course on how to teach small children and those who are partially impaired mentally.

Her education did not stop here. She got admission to the Institute of Ethnography of Academy of Sciences USSR to do a Ph.D in Ethnomusicology. After a short delay, she is now in the process of completing her thesis.

A Sri Lankan from Colombo, Shantha's musi cal talent comes from her parents. Her mother learnt piano in her childhood, while her father

the first to play the Esraj in Radio Ceylon. Shantha is married to a Bangladeshi named Sheikh Mansurrudin Ahmed. Her husband is an art director with a local firm, besides being an artist and stage designer for Nagorik. Her daughter, Poornika Gayathri, is at the end of her graduate studies in engineering from the Wichita State University, USA. She is an able successor to her mother since she also shows promise in art, singing and playing the piano.

And the future? She hopes to pursue her study of music therapy. This discipline seeks to heal people through the art of music. Shantha describes music therapy as a means of treatment for people with psychological disorders, troubled teenagers, and terminally ill patients. To quote her, Music therapy can help people who suffer abuse, drug addicts and the elderly, among others. One can divert their minds by teaching them piano or singing and help them to step out of

Sensitive to the needs of the physically and mentally challenged, in 1997 she worked as a voluntary music teacher at a public school in Sydney. Here she conducted a rehabilitation class to teach music to partially disabled children. This was one of my most memorable teaching experiences,' she recalls.

In many ways, Shantha has contributed to the western music scene here. Her numerous gifted students are certainly her best torchbearers.

Foreign plays in Bangla

Abdus Selim speaks of his passion

The play Galileo, since its first staging has received whole-hearted appreciation of the audience. This play, written by Bertolt Brecht, was translated in 1974 by Abdus Selim, a renowned translator of Bangladesh. And this was the first ever translated play in Bangla that was

staged. So far, Selim has translated several famous plays of the world. These have been staged several times by different theatre groups such as Dhaka-Padatik, Nagorik Natyangan and Little Theatre. These are: Venice Shaodagar -- a translation of William Shakespeare's The Merchant of Venice, Phera (The Visit of Duran Mart), Bigya Nathan (Nathan the Wise of Lessing), Himmati Ma and Golmatha Chokhamatha (Mother Cour-Ma and Golmaina Chokhamaina (Moiner Chil-age and Her Children and Round Heads and Pick Heads of Bertolt Brecht), and Majhrater Manushera (Nocturnal Wanderer of Gao Xing Xian). Among the plays, Himmati Ma and Golmatha Chokhamatha were highly appreciated by the audience and critics.

Abdus Selim has also translated plays for the students of North South University Cine and Drama Club. As a professor at the university, he introduced drama as a subject in the university. The plays he has translated for the university are Mouse Trap of Agatha Christie and The Would Be Gentleman of Moliere.

Before Galileo, Selim had translated the biography of Pablo Neruda, a few poems of British poets Kingsley, Amis and Ted Huges.

British poets Kingsley Amis and Ted Huges, Brecht and poems of the Bengali poets of the 1960s. However, he never thought about translating any plays for stage yet.

He says, 'I was involved with the film society movement since my student life. But, because of some differences in opinion, I left the society. Then I felt the urge to do something. Film director Mashihuddin Shaker gave me the play Galileo and told me to translate it. That was the start-

In 1986, an American freelance theatre activist read Galileo. He proposed that the play be staged in Bangladesh with performers from different theatre groups. The activist met the performers but the performers but he p because of technical problems. That proposal encouraged Selim to look at new translation

Later in 1988, a prominent theatre group Nagorik Natya Samprodaya staged the play Galileo under the direction of Ataur Rahman. The play ran for 50 successful shows. 'All the 50 shows were staged at the Goethe Institut because the set was suitable for the play,' says Selim.

Although Himmati Ma was a successful play, could not run for a long spell because the eading actress of the play left the group. The play Golmatha Chokhamatha is still showing.

Most of the plays translated by Selim have been directed by Ataur Rahman. According to Selim, Ataur Rahman is one of the best directors 'I feel proud because most of the renowned


actors such as Aly Zaker, Asaduzzaman Noor, Lucky Inam, Nima Rahman and Khaled Khan

have performed in my plays,' says Selim.

Abdus Selim shies away from writing an original play. As he says modestly, 'I do not think I have that kind of talent.'

Recently Selim has translated three more plays--King Lear of Shakespeare, Lady from the Sea of Ibsen and The Government Inspector of Nikolai Gogol--which are to be staged this year. Now Selim wishes to translate the play The Brand

RAJ KAPOOR: 'The Tramp' lives on

Who doesn't remember Raj Kapoor? Described as a megastar, producer, director and all-round showman, his films such as Aag, Awaara, Shri 420 live on in the collective memory. Known variously as "The Tramp" and the 'Charlie Chaplin of India', he has combined the romantic element with the struggle of the under-

The son of famous film giant Prithviraj Kapoor, Raj Kapoor started out as a clapper boy. He wrested his first film role at the age of 11. In 1948 he set up his own studio and made his first feature film, Aag. Aag was a trendsetter in that it challenged the tradinai order orsympan forward storytelling. It this film, he partnered Nargis whose off and on screen chemistry caught the public attention in other movies as well.

Aag ranked among other successes, such as Barsaat and Shri 420. He also appealed to patriotic sentiment in films such as Aag and Jis desh mein Ganga behti hai (The country in which the Ganges flows). One of Kapoor's film songs in which he pays tribute to his motherland goes as follows:

Myshoes are Japanese And the trousers are English The cap on my head is Russian But my heart is Hindustani



Kapoor's songs and films captured the heartsof audiences not just in India but also in large parts of Africa, the Middle East and the former

After the box office failure of Mera Naam Joker (My name is Joker), his films took a more sensual turn. Take for instance, Bobby, which telescoped the love story of two youngsters, played ably by his son Rishi Kapoor and the exquisite Dimple Kapadia. Then followed Satyam Shivam Sundaram and Ram Teri Ganga Maili. One critic has aptly described him as exhibiting 'the carnality of a schoolboy' in his

To Kapoor goes the credit of introducing new talents in films such as his sons Rishi, Rai, Nimmi, Dimple Kapadia, Zeenat Aman and Mandakini. He also roped in music directors Shankar-Jaikishan and lyricist Hasrat Jaipuri under his banner. In addition, the songs of Barsaat, Andaaz and Mahal were instrumental in catapulting Lata Mangeshkar to the top as a playback singer. Raj Kapoor's innate musical sense gave his films a unique and memorable


