

# Four get life for raping girl

Four people have been sentenced to life imprisonment for gang-raping a girl at Shibalaya upazila in Manikganj district on April 28 last year.

The four-Aku Gazi, Shahadat Hossain alias Khadu, Abdul Mannan and Lutfor Pramanik-were convicted for raping Shilpi Chaterjee.

Of the convicts, Aku and Khadu were present in the court during the delivery of the judgement while Lutfor and Mannan were tried in absentia.

Judge Abu Hanif of the Speedy Trial Tribunal-3 yesterday pronounced the verdict at 1:30pm at a jam-packed courtroom.

The court acquitted Abdus Salam as the charge brought against him could not be proved.

The court also fined them Tk 20,000 each and asked the collector (District Magistrate) of Manikganj to realise the fine and pay it to the victim.

The punishment of the fugitives will be effective from the date of their arrest or surrender, the judge said.

Earlier, the prosecution and the defence completed their arguments and the court recorded statements of 18 prosecution witnesses.

In the case filed with Shibalaya Police Station, Shilpi Chaterjee alleged that a gang of assailants led by Abdus Salam entered their house at village Arua in Manikganj district breaking open the door at about 12:30am on April 28 last year and beat her parents.

The assailants dragged her father Shyamal out of the house, tied him with a mango tree and took her from her mother Renubala at gunpoint. Then Aku Gazi, Lutfor Pramanik, Mannan and Khadu raped her one after another at the East house while her two brothers-Kamal and Bimal-were sleeping at the north house. Shilpi lost her sense and five unknown assailants also raped her, the first information report said (FIR).

Later, Shilpi filed a rape case under the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act 2000 accusing Abdus Salam and four others the next day. The investigation officer pressed charges against Abdus Salam, Aku Gazi, Lutfor Pramanik, Mannan and Khadu on June 10 last year.

During the investigation, eight witnesses including complainant of the case gave judicial statements to first class magistrates on different dates.

Victim's father Shyamal Chaterjee and two brothers Kamal and Bimal were present in the court during the delivery of the verdict. They expressed their satisfaction over the judgement. But they expected the capital punishment to the rapists.

Special Public Prosecutor Nurul Iman Babul, advocates Abdus Sabur and Salma Jabin of Mahila Parishad and Ain and Salish Kendra appeared for the state while advocates Tahmina and Badsha defended the accused.

## AUGUST 21 GRENADE ATTACK Hasina blames Speaker for not allowing discussion

Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Sheikh Hasina yesterday criticised Speaker Barrister Jamir Uddin Sircar for not allowing Awami League (AL) MPs to discuss the August 21 grenade attack.

She said that the Speaker did not pay heed to AL's demand for discussing the August 21 grenade attack on the instruction from the prime minister.

Hasina said the policy of the BNP-Jamaat alliance government is to "victimise the victim" and that was once again proved in the House on Wednesday.

Her comment came when Comilla District Bar Association leaders, led by its Vice-President Advocate Abul Kashem and General Secretary Hashem Khan met the AL president at her Dhanmondi residence in the afternoon.

She said when different countries were expressing their strong condemnation of the grenade attack, the Parliament did not accept the adjournment motion pleaded by the AL lawmakers.

"This proves that the government itself had patronised the August 21 grenade attack. This government victimises the victims," she said adding that the government destroyed all evidences of the attack to save the attackers.

# Number of poor to halve by 2015, hopes PM

## National Social Service Academy inaugurated

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday said poverty is the biggest hurdle to the development and expressed her optimism about cutting the number of the poor to half by year 2015.

"Poverty is the biggest hurdle on our road to progress," Khaleda said this while she was inaugurating the National Social Service Academy at Agargaon yesterday.

Khaleda reiterated that poverty alleviation is the immediate goal of the government and determined it as the biggest social service.

She also said overall and balanced development is not possible without integrating the backward and downtrodden people in the mainstream of economic activities.

Presided over by Social Welfare Secretary Kazi Monwarul Huq, the function was also addressed by Minister for Social Welfare Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mujahid, Advocate Khandakar Mahbubuddin Ahmed and Director General of Social Welfare Directorate Hafizul Islam Miah.

Ministers, MPs, diplomats, representatives of donor agencies and leaders of social welfare organisations were present at the function.

The prime minister in her speech said her government is implementing social welfare programmes and urged all to stand beside the less fortunate, helpless and rootless.

"We not only consider as our state responsibility to show respect to them, help them become self-reliant and provide strength and courage but also look at it as humanitarian responsibility towards fellowmen."

She said that lending programmes have been expanded to increase the earnings of the poorest of the poor, such as distressed women and children, orphans and handicapped.

She expressed her optimism that the number of poorer sections of people in the country would be reduced half by the year 2015.

Khaleda hoped that the social service academy would act as a national institution of raising trained field workers on different aspects of social services. She said the present trend of moral erosion and idleness misguided a section of youths and urged the trained social workers to provide proper guidance and counselling to those and bring back to the mainstream of society to raise them as creative citizens.

She said her government has further expanded the 'social safety net' under which

programmes of food for work, housing for the homeless, rehabilitation of acid-burned, physically handicapped and risk-facing due to natural disaster are being implemented.


Khaleda said that these steps reduced the number of poor, as reflected in the human development index.

She said under the social safety net, the government expanded the old-age allowance, raising the amount to Tk 165 from Tk 100 each. The government raised the number of beneficiaries

of old-age allowance to 13.15 lakh from 4.15 lakh, and enhanced the allowance for each insolvent freedom fighter to Tk 500 from Tk 300.


She went around the stalls set up on the premises to display handicrafts and other materials produced by various social-welfare organisations.

The prime minister unveiled the plaque of the six-storied building of the academy that will train up the poor in various technical trades. The project cost Tk 6.12 crore.
