



Dhaka, Delhi agree to coordinate patrols

Kakri joins Gumti in flooding 100 villages

Close on the heels of Gumti, a swollen Kakri also burst its banks Wednesday being unable to contain the huge rainwater rushing down from the Tipura Hills.

Together the two rivers have flooded over 100 villages and marooned around six lakh people in Devidwar, Burichong, Choudhogram and Muradnagar upazilas in southeastern Comilla district yesterday.

Meanwhile, in Devidwar, 14

Awami League activists on relief work among the flood victims were severely injured yesterday in a clash with cadres of ruling BNP.

The Gumti that burst through its dam earlier Wednesday spread further yesterday inundating 100 unions and threatening Bakhrabad Gas Fields, while Dhaka with its low-lying areas still under water saw the sun for the first time after a five-day unprecedented deluge.

The second bout of flooding this season caused by the heaviest downpour in more than 50 years killed

Bangladesh to give Indians double-entry and exit visa, consider extradition treaty

Bangladesh and India agreed to coordinate patrols in their own territories by their security forces and Dhaka agreed to grant double-entry and exit visas to Indians transiting through international air and land ports before wrapping up home secretary level talks yesterday.

Dhaka said it was ready to sign an agreement to enhance cooperation in security issues, if required and also agreed to consider New Delhi's proposal for an extradition treaty and respond to it at a meeting between the two countries likely to be held in next January or early February.

New Delhi, on the other hand, proposed a three-point package proposal for Dhaka to notify India on the 1974 Land Boundary Agreement and agreed to work towards a more concrete solution to the problem after receiving Dhaka's response to the package.

The coordinated patrol of the borders came as a compromise to India's proposal of joint security operations along the borders and entailed exchange of information on terrorists and criminals' movement across the borders. But the nature of the patrol was still unclear.

Two stabbed to death in city

A landlord stabbed by the robbers on Tuesday died in the early hours yesterday in Merul Badda and a cloth store employee was stabbed to death at Shantibagh in Motijheel yesterday evening.

Mujibur Rahman, 55, accounts officer of Shaheed Suhrawardy College died on returning home after treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) on Thursday.

On Tuesday, a band of seven robbers broke into his house while it was raining very hard. They stabbed him and his daughter Mahfuz Aftab, 28, and beat up the other members of the family. Mujibur received several stabs in the head, cheek and right thigh.

The robbers took away valuables

The organisation held a rally and marched in procession from Baitul Mukarram National Mosque, demanding that the government declare Ahmadiyya sect non-Muslim. They also demanded arrest of the Ahmadiyya supporters including Kabir Chowdhury, Hasan Imam and Shahriar Kabir.

Arguments in '99 Chhatak blast case start today

Arguments in the Chhatak bomb blast case will begin in the Divisional Speedy Trial Tribunal, Sylhet, today official sources said.

The blast occurred at the residence of then ruling party MP Muhibur Rahman Manik at Chhatak upazila headquarters on March 15, 1999, killing two people on the spot and injuring two others, allegedly at the time of bomb-making.

One of the injured succumbed to his injuries at the hospital.

The blast caused a huge damage to the first floor of the two-story building. Manik was not present at his residence during the incident. He filed a case with Chhatak Police Station the following day. The then officer-in-charge of the police station also filed a case in connection with the blast on March 26.
