'Ivy was killed by defeated forces'

Speakers at a condolence meeting yesterday paid rich tributes to Ivy Rahman, women affairs secretary of Awami League (AL) who was killed in the August 21 grenade attack in the city.

The meeting was organised by Bangladesh Mahila Samity at Neelima Ibrahim auditorium.

In a statement sent to the meeting, AL President Sheikh Hasina said Ivy was killed by the defeated forces of 1971 who want to eliminate her party.

She prayed for the salvation of the departed soul.

Advocate Sahara Khatun read out the statement.

Justice KM Sobhan said Ivy was

killed for her secular politics.

He said her death has created a vacuum in politics.

AL Presidium Member Sajeda Chowdhury said the death of Ivy is a great loss for the nation.

The government is not at all interested in the investigation of the grenade attack that took away her life and other AL leaders, she added.

Prof Anisuzzaman of Dhaka University, President of Group Theatre Federation Mamun-ur-Rashid, Vice-president of BAMS Bela Nabi, and General Secretary of Mahila Muktijoddha Sangsad Dr Magduma Nargis also spoke on the occasion.
