Kelly Holmes, who won the 800-1,500 double in Athens, has been named as the International Association of Athletics Federations' women's performance of the year award.

Ethiopian distance runner Kenenisa Bekele and Russian polevaulter Yelena Isinbayeya won the male and female athletes of the year awards.

Bekele, 22, won the world crosscountry long and short course titles for the third consecutive time this year.

He set a world indoor 5,000 record and also broke his compatriot Haile Gebrselassie's world outdoor 5,000 and 10,000 marks before going on to win the Olympic 10,000 metres title in Athens followed by a silver medal behind Morocco's Hicham El Guerroui in the 5.000.

Isinbayeva, also 22, won the Olympic title and set eight world records, three of them indoors.

El Guerrouj was given a special award for the male performance of the year with his Olympic 1,500 and 5,000 double.

Trophy comes alive

The ICC Champions Trophy has finally burst into life with Pakistan and West Indies recording thrilling victories over India and South Africa to set up an intriguing semifinal showdown.

Pakistan sneaked to a nervy three-wicket win over India at Edgbaston, overhauling their rivals' 200 all out with four balls to spare while West Indies' win was equally tight, beating South Africa at the Oval by five-wickets with seven balls left.

"I think we showed a lot of character. We won the crucial parts of the game," West Indies captain Brian Lara said on Sunday. "Wickets in hand is what one-day cricket is all

If Pakistan and West Indies can perform in their semifinal as they did on Sunday, their match at the Rose Bowl in Southampton on Wednesday should be peppered with incisive bowling, explosive hitting but most crucially some cool, calm batting amid chaos.

West Indian Shivnarine Chanderpaul and Pakistan's Yousuf Youhana were the lynchpins of Sunday's run chases and their sides might have lost without them.

Man-of-the-match Youhana hit an unbeaten 81 from 114 balls and even needed a runner towards the end as cramp set in but he battled on to take his team to their third successive win over India.

Chanderpaul made 51 from 52 to take the game away from South Africa and help make amends for West Indies' poor recent form.

Pakistan seamers Shoaib Akhtar and Rana Naved-ul-Hasan took four for 36 and four for 25 respectively to set up their win although India, especially Irfan Pathan who bagged three cheap early wickets, did well to nearly force a victory.

Nevertheless captain Sourav

Ganguly knew where the game had

"We have not been playing good cricket since the time we came back after our break," he said. "If you look at the last four months we have just not had enough totals. But it is not a worry, we know we are a good side."

Australia and England will contest the other semifinal at Edgbaston on Tuesday after the world champions eased to victory over New Zealand on Thursday and the hosts needed heavy rain and Duckworth-Lewis to send Sri Lanka packing on Saturday.

Before Sunday the tournament had been dogged by one-sided matches against minor cricketing nations and the unpredictable English weather.

Many have criticised the International Cricket Council for organising the tournament in the English autumn but it has argued September fits in well between the cricket seasons in the northern and southern hemispheres.

Even West Indies' match with

South Africa in Pool B was rolled over from Saturday when rain brought a halt to proceedings with Brian Lara's men on 20 without loss after a century from Herschelle Gibbs took South Africa to 246 for

The spectacle at the Oval on Sunday made up for that, Ramnaresh Sarwan striking 75 and Ricardo Powell firing West Indies towards victory with 16 from 10

Shahid Afridi mirrored the feat for Pakistan smashing 25 off 12 including two sixes in one Pathan over to snatch any initiative from India.

Captain Inzamamul Haq also made an important 41 after his side were wobbling on 27 for three and in the process became only the second player after Sachin Tendulkar to reach 10,000 one-day runs.

"The boys played really well together especially the bowlers and in the end Yousuf Youhana played an excellent knock," he said.

China sends F1 pulses racing

Next weekend's inaugural Chinese Grand Prix could be the most significant race in the history of Formula

That may sound over the top. particularly with both constructors' and drivers' titles won already by Ferrari and seven-times champion Michael Schumacher, but it is what Mercedes motorsport boss Norbert "In my view this is a very impor-

tant race, probably the most important race in the history of motorsport," declared the German.

Shanghai, with a breathtaking circuit and a sellout crowd of at least 150,000, is one of two debut grands prix this year -- the other was Bahrain's first race in the Middle East -- that allow Formula One to boast of being a truly global championship.

"It is a new era and I think we will have more spectators worldwide for television than for any race before...especially in America I think there will be a lot mentioned about the race," said Haug.

Mercedes are part owners of McLaren and, like other carmakers in Formula One, they are licking their lips at the prospect of putting on a show in the world's most populous nation and fastestgrowing market.

Even if the average Chinese. with an annual salary of \$1,000, can only dream of owning a car, the market is potentially massive although there are fears of a margin-sapping glut emerging as new plants come on stream.

'Follow the money' has long been a mantra for the costly glamour sport and comparisons have even been made between Formula One's efforts to win over China and the 19th century Canadian gold

"China is the Klondike. it's the new frontier," said BAR boss David Richards, whose team are partnered by Japanese auto giant

"The new regions, especially China with 1.3 billion people who for the first time are coming into contact with Formula One, that's the future," said BMW motorsport head Mario Theissen.

"I will be very cautious about it being the most important," said Ferrari boss Jean Todt. "But I've been in Shanghai for the opening of the circuit because we were opening our showroom as well and it's unbelievable what they have done, just unique.

"This year we will sell about 50 cars in China, hoping that we will sell 100 cars next year.

"It will take a long time before we will be able to compare China to the United States, which is over 30 percent of our market, but countries like China, India and Russia definitely have a huge potential."

Theissen said China was already BMW's fastest growing market in the luxury bracket, with more sales there of the top-of-therange 760Li V12 than in any other

The Munich carmaker's sales in mainland China, Hong Kong and Taiwan grew to 16,620 cars in the first eight months of this year -- an increase of 23.9 percent over the same period in 2003 -- with almost half of them built in China.

"In terms of market power, think nothing so far compares with this race," said Theissen, whose company have a local joint venture -- BMW Brilliance Automotive Ltd. which has been making 3 and 5 series models for the last year.

"I think it is unique and we are really looking forward to it," he

Honda and the world's second largest carmaker Toyota are well established there while Renault -which owns 44 percent of Nissan -have forged a joint venture with Dongfeng Motor Corp.

Jaguar, whose owners Ford are pulling out of Formula One at the end of the season and selling the team, began marketing in China this year with the first 20 buyers promised that they would have their names put on the grand prix

But selling cars is only a part of what China offers to Formula One.

The other side is the commercial attraction for sponsors, with existing backers eager to increase brand awareness and teams hoping that new partners will be encouraged in.

"Everybody commercially is looking at the Far East, looking at China, the growth in China, the potential markets out there. It certainly broadens our horizons as a sport," said Richards, whose team is owned by tobacco giant

China, with cigarette branding allowed at the race, is a key market

"It's more about when you talk to companies, they are all looking to expand their markets and China is obviously on everybody's agenda," added Richards.

"When you say that you have a race in China that certainly raises people's interest levels," he said.

"I personally think it's more likely to attract sponsors in the West looking to get awareness and a foothold in China. I think it's rare to see Chinese companies who yet understand the potential of Formula One for promoting themselves on a global basis but I'm sure that will follow."

Jordan, among the tail-enders on the track, have set the pace there with two Chinese sponsors already -- property developer Shoulu-Huayuan and B&Q China.

Paralympics China climb atop table

China edged to the top of the medals table at the end of the second day of the Athens Paralympics, and was poised to continue its strong showing as competition resumed on

Three other countries also picked up five gold medals over the weekend: traditional Paralympics powerhouses Spain and Britain, along with Germany.

Hong Kong hung on tenaciously to its unexpectedly high standings, earning its fourth gold medal -- like the other three, in wheelchair fencing -- on Sunday, but slipped from 1st into 5th in the overall medals table.

Still shaken by doping scandals at the Sydney Paralympics, where 11 athletes were disqualified for using banned substances, the Interna-tional Paralympics Committee has stepped up doping controls at Athens. "We have carried out 209 con-

trols so far," said IPC spokeswoman Miriam Wilkens. "All of them were negative," she

Among the highlights Sunday was a spectacular 10,000-metre final for blind non-seeing runners, Henry Wanyoike of Kenya, shattered his own world record by nearly one minute, finishing in 31 minutes and 37.25 seconds.

"Even Henry was surprised," said Wanyoike's guide, Joseph Kibunja Gachui, who runs along with him during competition tethered by a rope. The able-bodied world record is

under 27 minutes.

In wheelchair basketball, one of the marquee sports at the Paralympics, Australia, Canada and Germany were at the top of their pools in both men's and women's competition, almost certain to advance to the next round. Athletes in the Paralympics, the

premier sporting event for the disabled, compete over 12 days in 19 sports in six different categories of disability, resulting in more than 500 podiums and 3,000 medals


