The parliamentary standing committee on energy and mineral resources ministry at a meeting yesterday formed a sub-committee to probe alleged allegations of financial irregularities in the Baropukuria Coal Mine Development Project.

Baropukuria Coalfield discovered by Bangladesh Geological Survey Department in 1985 is situated in the northwestern part of the country in the district of Dinajpur. Petrobangla completed necessary survey in 1990 and found that about 70 million tonnes of high quality coal that is worth over Tk 22 thousand crore, can be recovered from the coalfield

"No nation can proceed on the highway of the present world of development without application of knowledge and science and innovation of new technologies," the prime minister said while opening the planetarium named Bhasani Novo Theatre.

Built at a cost of Tk 120 crore, the project has been jointly implemented by the Ministry of Science and Information Communications Technology and the Ministry of Housing and Public Works.

The planetarium houses three exhibition halls where evolution process of the animal world will be on display. A 250-seat lecture hall will be used for holding seminars and symposia on issues pertaining
