



## Moderate rain likely

Light to moderate rain or thundershowers accompanied by temporary gusty wind is likely at a few places over Rajshahi, Dhaka and Sylhet divisions and at one or two places over Khulna, Barisal and Chittagong divisions in the next 12 hours till 6.00pm today.

Day temperature may remain nearly unchanged during the period, Met Office said.

Yesterday's highest temperature of 35.5 degree Celsius was recorded at Mongla and lowest of 23.4 degrees at Srimangal.

The sun sets in the capital at 5:45pm today and rises at 5:51 am tomorrow.

## Shudhangshu Sekhar Halder cremated

Former lawmaker and Awami League leader Shudhangshu Sekhar Halder, who died of cancer at Birdem Hospital in Dhaka on Wednesday night, was cremated at his village in Morelganj with state honour yesterday.

AL leaders from Bagerhat, Khulna and Pirojpur, including AL President Sheikh Hasina's representative Habibur Rahman, attended the funeral ceremony at a crematorium near Suhasini Secondary School, named after Halder's mother.

Upazila Nirbahi officer, officer-in-charge of local police station and freedom fighters were also present.

The body of Halder was brought from Pirojpur yesterday morning to Shailakhal village in Morelganj and kept on the Suhasini School premises where villagers and party activists paid their last respects to the late leader.

A senior lawyer of the Supreme Court, Halder was one of the organisers of the War of Liberation in 1971 and was elected member of parliament from Pirojpur-1 constituency in 1979 and 1991.

## 250 low vision units needed for 7.5 lakh patients

A total of 250 low vision units comprising at least one ophthalmologist, one paramedic and one counsellor are needed for serving 7.5 lakh patients across the country.

This was stated at a workshop

on 'Low Vision' organised by Islamia Eye Hospital in the city on Thursday.

"The country has only four low vision centres, two in Dhaka and one each in Chittagong and Sirajganj. These centres are quite insufficient for the treatment of so many low vision patients," said Dr Sayedul Haque, assistant professor of the National Institute of Ophthalmology Hospital.

He said there are only six trained ophthalmologists, nine paramedics and four counsellors in the country to treat the low vision patients.

"Lack of trained personnel, logistic support, low vision centre and awareness are the main obstacles to serve the low vision patients," said Dr Sayedul Haque.

Presided over by Director General of Islamia Eye Hospital Prof Khan M A Manzur, the workshop was also addressed by Chairman of Ophthalmology Department of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University Prof Salehuddin and Advisor of Islamia Eye Hospital Zahida Ispahani.
