Govt to assess Tata's plan with donor help

Gas pricing, supply crucial issues

The government will evaluate with donors' help the pricing and supply of gas for Tata Group's \$2 billion planned power, steel and fertiliser plants in Bangladesh.

"Technical know-how is needed to evaluate such investment proposals," Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman told reporters after a meeting with visiting Tata Group Chairman Ratan N Tata at his planning ministry office yesterday. The WB has already offered


