## Ex-air force chief Jamal stripped of air marshal rank

The government has stripped for mer air force chief Jamal Uddin Ahmed of his rank of air marshal citing 'unlawful elevation to the position' as the reason, said a defence ministry press release.

The Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), press wing of the defence ministry, issued the press release yesterday.

Earlier a week ago, former army chief Mustafizur Rahamn too was

Most private universities in the country have miserably failed to serve the purposes for which they were set up, Chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Prof M Asaduzzaman said

The objectives of involving the private sector in the field of university education were to impart quality education, create scope for joboriented education and facilitate

more access to and bring competitiveness in higher education.

But the most deplorable fact is that 40 to 45 such institutions out of 52 have not yet met fully the prerequisites laid down by the government under the Private University Act, 1992," Asaduzzaman told The Daily

"We have found the performance of only a couple of institutions satisfactory," said Asaduzznman, who headed a high-powered

## Price mismatch mystery

Consumers in capital are paying as high as four times the growers get for their produce because of extortion, cartel

If reports from the fields are something to go by, there persists a wide disparity between the prices that the northern growers are getting for their produce and the prices consumers in Dhaka are now paying for

While growers in Rangpur are selling aubergine at Tk 20 a kg, retailers at Dhaka's kitchen markets are charging as high as Tk 80. The farmers in Rajshahi are offering green chilli at Tk 55 a kg but consumers in the capital are forced to buy it at Tk 120 to Tk 160.

## Most AL lawmakers for joining Sangsad

Eager to make their presence felt in JS bodies

Most Awami League (AL) lawmakers are displeased with the party high command's stance on not joining the upcoming session of the Jatiya Sangsad and participating in all the parliamentary standing commit-

The main opposition lawmakers are willing to join the session scheduled for October 28 and participate in the parliamentary bodies to register their protests and speak against what they say are the corruption and failure of different minis-

As the party high command has not yet made its position clear whether it will continue to boycott the parliamentary proceedings and abstain from joining the parliamentary bodies, many AL deputies have got frustrated, party insiders said.

The AL lawmakers started to boycott the parliamentary proceedings from September 14 in protest against speaker's refusal to their demand to hold discussion on the August 21 grenade attacks on a party rally, adjourning the House's busi-

The main opposition lawmakers are yet to join the parliamentary standing committees, except a few, after they were included in the bodies on September 16, one year into the formation of the committees, in line with a list sent by the AL.

The AL lawmakers are participating in the meetings of House Committee, Private Members Bills and Resolution Committee only.

## Target to stabilise population at 21.60cr by 2060

Cabinet okays draft policy

The cabinet yesterday approved the draft of the National Population Policy 2004 (NPP 2004) that focuses on bringing down population growth rate to 1 percent by 2010 from 1.54 percent now.

The new policy aims to stabilise Bangladesh's population at 21.60 crore by 2060, and to that end the net reproductive rate (NRR) has to come down to one percent by 2010.

First outlined in 1976 and revised by a nine-member committee since 2002 the draft NPP 2004 comprises 16 specific objectives that include bringing down maternal and infant

mortality rates, and seven implementation strategies like empowerment of women, human development and decentralisation of programme implementation.

Maternal mortality rate (MMR) in Bangladesh now is one of the highest in the world with 320 women dying during childbirth, out of every 1,000 live births (3:2/1,000). Infant mortality rate (IMR) is also quite high compared to that in any other developing country. About 70 infants die out of every 1,000.

In view of the high MMR, the new policy particularly emphasises women's reproductive health

## Same model grenades used in Sylhet, AL rally

## Scotland Yards submits finds to police

The grenade hurled on British High Commissioner Anwar Choudhury at Hazrat Shahjalal Shrine in Sylhet on May 21 was of the same model as those found on Bangabandhu Avenue on August 21 and at Dhaka Central Jail the following day.

The Scotland Yards that assisted local investigators in the probe into the grenade attack said in its report that the grenade hurled on the Bangladesh-born British high commissioner was one of ARGES model.

Three grenades retrieved from Bangabandhu Avenue area after the August 21 grisly attack on an Awami League rally that killed 20 people and injured about 200 and another one recovered from Dhaka Central Jail the following day were of the same model, the report said.

The Criminal Investigation Department (CID), which is currently probing the May 21 incident, received the Scotland Yards report

The CID, however, is yet to dig out clues to the grenade attack.

The British detective agency gathered evidence from the spot two days after the attack that killed three including a policeman.
