## Robbery at Ctg shop, 4 shot

Four employees of an Aarong Milk dealer's shop were bullet-hit during a robbery at Colonel Hat area under Pahartali Police Station yesterday morning.

The armed gang took away Tk 48,000 in cash from the shop, police said.

The four bullet-hit were Yousuf Meah, Md Faruk, Nurul Alam and Abu Musa. They are taking treatment at Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH).

Police quoting the dealer said the robbers numbering eight to ten stormed into the shop at around 8.15 am yesterday. They beat up the staff and looted the money from the cash at gunpoint. But as they were fleeing with the booty the four tried to resist them and got shots.

Dealer Abul Kalam Azad filed a case with the Pahartali PS.

## Medicine shop ransacked

Criminals ransacked a medicine shop at Mitford Hospital premises in old part of the city yesterday as the owner refused to pay them Tk 2 lakh in illegal toll.

Hospital sources said a gang of five, reportedly local BNP activists, came to MH Medical Hall and demanded the toll.

As the owner expressed his

inability to pay, the criminals led by Haji Kamal and Tuhin ransacked the shops and locked it.

They also beat the shop employees.

However, they later allowed the owner to open the shop.

Hospital sources said the shop owner did not file any case against the criminals with the local police station for fear of reprisal.

## Irregularities in JU admission under quotas

Irregularities have been alleged in admitting students at Jahangirnagar University (JU) under various quotas in 2003-04 academic session.

The Central Admission Committee, at a meeting on October

18, selected a total of 230 students for admission.

Of them, 63 were selected under cultural quota from 360 applicants while 64 each from freedom fighters and sports quotas from 600 and 640 applicants respectively.

Twenty-six and 15 students were selected under Ward and Tribal quotas respectively.

According to sources, around 10 students were selected on the recommendation of ministers, 20 to meet the request of BNP lawmakers and secretaries, around 70 on the recommendation of the teachers loyal to the vice-chancellor and the Awami League and the rest under the influence of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) leaders and JU employees raising question about transparency and credibility of the process.

JCD leaders took Tk 30,000 to Tk 50,000 from each student who was selected on their recommendations, the sources added.

"Only 10 applicants were qualified to be selected under sports quota and at best 14 more could be admitted on recommendations from 64 applicants," said a member of the sports quota admission committee.

Informed sources said some students were selected under cultural quota without showing their performances while some others got selection under freedom fighter quota showing fake certificates.

"I had formed several committees to select qualified students under quotas. They were selected on the basis of their merits," said Vice-chancellor Prof Khandaker Mustahidur Rahman.

Admission of the students under various quotas will begin on November 1 and continue till November 10.

## Distribution of JU admission forms begins Nov 8
