"The government has identified illegal land occupation as a national crisis, and we have to address it,' Sadat Hossain said after the meet-

He, however, said the problem will not be solved overnight, it will take a lot of time.

The next meeting of the committee, formed in February this year, will review the recommendations sent by the local administrations.
