

Bush vows no letup in Iraq, war on terror

Bolstered by a hard-fought election victory, President Bush says the United States will vigorously pursue wars in Iraq and against terror and will not retreat from trying to spread democracy through the Middle East.

"I understand, in certain capitals and certain countries, those decisions were not popular," Bush said at his first post-election news conference Thursday. But he was unapologetic about the course he has set and said he would not back

Before flying to his retreat at Camp David to rest after the grueling campaign, Bush took congratu-latory calls from world leaders and



The White House said it saw a new opportunity to advance Middle East peace now that Bush has won a second term and Israel has taken steps to withdraw from Gaza after nearly 40 years of occupation.
