Former world number one Roddick was outserved and outpaced by qualifier Max Mirnyi of Belarus 7-6, 6-2 in just 65 minutes.

The American, who had been out of action for a month after the US Open, looked out of steam against an opponent who beat him at his

own game.

The tiebreak, which the towering Mirnyi, dubbed the Beast, won 7-2, set the tone for a one-sided second

Hitting aces and service winners, the Belarussian never let the hapless Roddick back into the match. Holder Henman, beaten 7-5, 6-1

by another in-form player, Russian Mikhail Youzhny, made it clear he had turned his sights towards the Masters Cup.

"To be honest, the goal was to qualify for Houston. It's been a while since I have been in the world championships if you like," said the Briton, who played in the season-ending tournament in 1997 and 1998 before it became the Masters Cup.

The third-seeded Briton had made Paris almost his second home in the last year, winning the most lucrative of the Masters Series tournaments in Bercy a year ago before reaching the French Open semifi-

### Chelsea slam weak' FA

Chelsea chief executive Peter Kenyon accused the Football Association (FA) of being "weak on drugs" after the club's former striker Adrian Mutu was banned for seven months for failing a dope test.

Mutu tested positive for cocaine, a banned substance, in September Ithough he later denied th druginvolved. He was also fined 20,000 pounds

and told his suspension would be subject to completing a "programme of education and rehabilitation." Controversially, Mutu's ban was

shorter than the eight month suspension the FA gave to Manchester United and England defender Rio Ferdinand for missing a drugs test.

It was also less than the nine month ban imposed on former Chelsea keeper Mark Bosnich, although the Australian refused to accept his guilt unlike Romania captain Mutu. Chelsea terminated Mutu's con-

tract on the grounds of "gross misconduct," as part of their "zero-tolerance" drugs policy and Kenyon was angry that the FA, who could have banned Mutu for two years, had not been

"Chelsea are extremely disap-pointed with this verdict. We believe it is far too lenient and sends out the wrong message about drugs in foot-

"It is also indicative of a lack of direction within the FA at this time," added Kenyon in a reference to the governing body being without a chief

'As a club we can only take the action that we believe is right for "However, the FA have a much

wider responsibility to look after the interests of the game as a whole and, in this case, we believe it has shown itself to be weak over the issue of drugs." But the FA's stance was backed by

Professional Footballers Association chief executive Gordon Taylor who has been critical of Chelsea's drugs


