#### BILLAL MURDER CASE HC cancels

# govt order

The High Court has cancelled a government order to change the public prosecutor (PP) of the Billal Hossain Bepari murder case.

A division bench of Justice Abdul Matin and Justice AFM Abdur Rahman on October 26 also ordered the government to appoint a special PP, who never appeared for either the accused or any witness of the case, to conduct the trial.

The case filed more than 12 years ago for the killing of Billal, an employee of Titas Gas, is still awaiting verdict after 27 hearings at the High Court (HC) Division and 21 at the Supreme Court (SC) Appellate

During the course of trial, six judges felt embarrassed, eight PPs were transferred and nine of the 34 prosecution witnesses declared hostile. The case remained suspended ever since the SC stayed its proceedings on October 22, 1998.

Four months ago, the government transferred special PP Abdul Mannan who was tasked with conducting the case during the tenure of the previous government, and gave an order to appoint PP Abdullah Mahmood Hassan or someone he thinks eligible to conduct the case.

Later, Assistant PP Khorshed Alam, who earlier appeared for a plantiff and witness of the case since the beginning of the trial, was tasked with conducting the case.

The High Court order came following the filing of a writ by an accused, Latif Hossain, and nine

witnesses. Billal died on July 9, 1992, after falling from the sixth floor of Titas Bhaban at Karwan Bazar. The then general manager (vigilance) of the company filed a first information report (FIR) with Tejgaon Police Station the same day.

The following day, Billal's cousin SM Zillur Rahman went to the police station to file another FIR, but police recorded it as a general diary against

A cabinet committee meeting yesterday agreed to make the law and frame a policy for guiding a sound growth of what is known as 'sky cul-


The meeting also decided to form a subcommittee that would submit its report by November 30 after reviewing the cable TV network policy and the draft cable TV network act.
