Crime on rise ahead of Eid

Crimes, including extortion and robbery, are on the rise in the port city ahead of the Eid.

And right from the beginning of Ramadan, the criminals come out of their hideouts.

Not a single day has passed from the first Ramadan without any incident of extortion, robbery and mugging in Chittagong city and elsewhere in the district. Mobile phone shop owners are the main targets of the criminals.

The most gruesome of all criminal activities was the murder of housewife Noor Nahar alias Milon on the night of November 3 at Al Falah Lane in the city's Nasirabad area. Noor Nahar, wife of an American expatriate, was killed by the criminals as she refused to pay toll. Police is looking for the prime accused Salahuddin alias Chhagol Babu.

Robbers on the night of November 5, stormed the Integra Communications Limited, a mobile dealer at Agrabad Commercial Area, by breaking open the door and looted Tk 1.5 lakh in cash, mobile sets and prepaid cards worth over Tk 12 lakh.

Mobilemooring police is yet to recover the looted goods or trace the criminals.

Criminals even didn't spare a disabled beggar. All the money of 55-year old Abdur Rashid was stolen when he was offering Juma prayers at Nasirabad Housing Society mosque on November 5 keeping his earnings of the day besides awall.

A gang of miscreants stormed into Mozzamel Electronics, a cell phone shop, at Agrabad Sheikh Mujib Road at 8.15pm on November 4. The masked criminals confined the shop owner Motahar Hossain and other staffs

at gunpoint and looted 52 CityCell sets, 16 GSM sets and Tk 36,000 in cash. They also assaulted Motahar and another employee before leaving the shop with the booty.

Meanwhile, a gang of four muggers, however, couldn't escape following the prompt act of an intelligent police officer and timely assistance of passers-by in front of Biman Office at Sholoshar Gate No-2 area the same day in the morning. The gang tried to snatch Tk 1.5 lakh from Mohammad Shahjahan, manager of a business firm, when he was returning to his shop in a rickshaw after withdrawing the money from Islami Bank Bangladesh.

Assistant Commissioner of Double m o o r i n g Z o n e Mohammad Ilias caught red handed two muggers as the gang was scuffling with Motahar to take him into an auto-rickshaw after a brief chase. Local people caught

two other muggers from the auto-rickshaw along with a loaded revolver.

The criminals looted Tk 2.5 lakh in cash, four mobile sets worth Tk 30,000 and a walkie-talkie from the counter of Saudia Paribahan at around 5.00am on November 1. They confined the staffs to the toilet during the robbery.

Another gang looted a steel gate and other construction materials from the under-construction building of Professor Mohiuddin, a teacher of mathematics of Chittagong University, at city's Hill-View Residential Area the same morning. The gang committed the crime as the CU teacher refused to meet their demand for extortion. Police, however, arrested the main culprit in the incident.

The miscreants attacked Priyotosh Chowdhury, a jeweller, and take away his motorbike, gold chain and mobile set at Nandipara in Raozan the same night. The incident occurred when the businessman was returning home from his shop at Sitakunda upazila.

A gang of muggers dragged one Mohammad Shahid out of Hathazari Bus Station and snatched Tk 1.5 lakh and a mobile set from him when he was taking Iftar on October 3. He was going to his village home at Dharmapur in Patikchhari from Chittagong city.






Police guard almost all shopping arcades and malls in the port city to ensure security of Eid shoppers and the shop owners.

Eid passengers hostage to ticket brokers

Sufferings of thousands of commuters mount

Sufferings of thousands of commuters eager to meet their near and dear ones away from the port city of Chittagong at Eid mounted due to unavailability of the tickets of inter-district buses and trains.

Black marketeers are holding a large chunk of tickets of the buses and trains prior to Eid.

Many people were found disgruntled and angry at the Battali railway station on November 8 after failing to get ticket. On the other hand, those who could procure tickets had to pay much higher than the actual fare.

Besides, the situation aggravated as the bus services enhanced the fare from Tk 30 to Tk 200 per seat ahead of the Eid. The fare will go up everyday till Eid Day, a staff of S Alam bus service said.

Bangladesh Railway started selling advance tickets on November 5 for five days on the occasion Eid. The tickets are sold between 8.00am and 4.00pm. But hundreds of passengers could not collect their tickets even standing on the long queue at the railway station just after having their

Sehri.

Md. Russel Bhuiyan, a staff of Bangladesh Betar, Chittagong Centre, on the queue for tickets on November 6 said that if a ticket is issued to the commuter, two others are being printed out from the computer to keep inside the counterdesk of the railway official.

"I came at the station after having my Sehri and the authorities started selling of tickets at 8.00am. But all the tickets were 'sold' within two hours and I could not procure a single ticket of

Subarna Express for November 11 to go home in Dhaka", Russel said.

Sources said, the black marketeers in connivance with a section of dishonest railway employees have booked most of the seats of the seven inter-city trains of different routes till the Eid day. As a result, hundreds of people intended to go home on Eid could not collect their advance tickets.

The railway authorities, however, denied the allegation of selling out tickets in blackmarkets.

Seven inter-city trains ply

three routes from Chittagong, including Chittagong-Dhaka, Chittagong-Sylhet and Chittagong-Chandpur, with capacity of 4,849 passengers daily.


Railway sources said, 3,847 tickets for November 10, 4,849 for November 11, 4,791 for November 12 and 3,500 tickets for November 13 have so far been sold out.

But the real scenario is different. While visiting the city's railway station, the correspondent found that there was no unsold tickets for November 5 and 6 in

Chittagong-Dhaka and Chittagong-Chandpur routes and hundreds of people went back without any ticket.

It was also found that blacker was selling tickets at the station on the nose of the railway authorities and the members of team responsible for checking blackmarketing of tickets.

One of the black marketeers said that they would earn Tk 100 against each seat from November 10. But he refused to reveal the source from where they collected

these tickets.

On the other hand, bus fare also went up unreasonably ahead of the Eid.

Mahmud Major, a student of Chittagong University told The Daily Star that he paid an additional price of Tk 150 than the normal price for a ticket of a bus run by Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) to go home in Rangpur.

"Normally state-owned BRTC sells each ticket at Tk 250 and the private buses at Tk 350. But I had to pay Tk 400 for a BRTC bus ticket while the price of private buses were charging Tk 200 more than the actual price against each ticket," he added.

Meanwhile, some 550 buses will ply under the supervision of Inter-district Bus Owners Association. The buses will ply 31 routes regularly and the fare would not be enhanced, association sources said. An official of the association preferring anonymity said that we are not responsible at all to check the fare hike. "Bangladesh Road and Transport Authority (BRTA) and traffic department of police are responsible," he added.

Equipment for the disabled
