

Attack on Sramik League leader in Khulna

Slain AL leader's son arrested

Members of the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested Arifur Rahman Mithu, 30, eldest son of slain Awami League mayoral candidate SMA Rob, from his residence at Noornagar under Sonadanga thana on Wednesday midnight.

He was sent to district jail yesterday afternoon.

Mithu, complainant of Rob murder case, has been named as one of the three accused in the FIR recorded under Speedy Trial Act on charge of assaulting Alauddin Al Azad, convenor of Khulna city unit of Jatiya Sramik League, on Wednesday night.

The injured Sramik League leader is now undergoing treatment at Khulna Surgical Clinic at Sonadanga.

According to the FIR recorded with Sonadanga thana, Mithu along with three others stormed a medicine store at Erfan market at 8:30pm on Wednesday and looted money and medicines.

Sramik League leader Azad, owner of the medicine shop, was beaten up for protesting the incident. The accused also vandalised the shop.

Meanwhile, Awami League, Sramik League, Jubo League and Chatra League brought out a joint procession in the city yesterday evening to protest against the incident.

Thai woman tortured for dowry: 5 held

Five members of a family were arrested in Nagariakandi of the town on Wednesday night on charge of torturing a Thai woman for dowry.

Police said Nazrul Islam, 32, son of Taleb Ali, went to Thailand two years ago and developed a relationship with the Thai woman, Darwan Thongkhom, 30. He later returned to Bangladesh with the Thai woman and married her.

Nazrul and his family members often used to put pressure on her to bring dowry worth 500,000 baht (Thai currency) from her father. They also tortured her as she refused to bring the dowry.

On Wednesday night, Nazrul and other members of his family again pressed for dowry. As Thongkhom refused, they tied her hands and legs and tried to strangle her. But their attempt was foiled as neighbours rushed to the house in aid of the Thai woman and informed police about the matter.

Later, police took the woman to the thana and arrested Nazrul, his father Taleb Ali, 76, brother Shahid Ullah, 18, sisters Ratna Begum, 23, and Rina Begum, 20.

Receiving the information, officials of the Thai Embassy in Dhaka went to Narsingdi and took the Thai woman along with her son Nazim in their custody the same night.

A police official of Sadar thana filed a case in this connection.

Bishwa Ijtema begins Dec 3

The three-day Bishwa Ijtema will begin at its regular venue in Tongi on December 3.

Tens of thousands of pilgrims are expected to attend the Ijtema from home and abroad. Many of them have already arrived in Dhaka from different countries.

The Ijtema will end on December 5 with Akheri Munajat.

Preparations for holding the Ijtema on 160-acre land on the bank of the river Turag are in full swing. Various government, private and religious organisations, Tongi Pourasava, local administration and Ijtema authorities are jointly carrying out the preparation work.

Agriculture Minister MK Anwar yesterday visited the site to see the progress of work. He also presided over a meeting to review the preparations.

Rahmat Ali MP, Zahid Ahsan Rasel MP, chairman of Tongi Pourasava Azmat Ali Khan, representatives of Roads and Highways Department, LGED, Wasa, Desa, Titas Gas, Public Health and Engineering Department, Rajuk, army, railway, Ijtema organisers, and local political leaders attended the meeting.

The meeting was told that two special trains from Jamalpur to Tongi, one special train from Akhaura and one from Noakhali would be pressed into service from November 30 to facilitate travel by

the pilgrims.

A total of 21 special trains would also be operated on different routes throughout the country on the day of Akheri Munajat. Besides, extra bogies would be attached to all regular trains.

Four entry roads around the Ijtema venue are being widened for smooth movement of the pilgrims. Five deep tube wells and seven-km lines have been set up to supply 25 lakh gallons of pure drinking water daily.

Apart from the private medical teams, some 18 government teams would be working in three shifts for providing health care. The number of beds in Tongi hospital has also been increased, the meeting was told.

Four criminals held after clash with police

Four criminals were arrested after clashes with police in the town and Fatullah on Wednesday night.

Ali and Dibba Halim and drug peddlers Sattar and Khokan were arrested with bullet injuries. They are close associates of Rakmat who died in crossfire few days ago. Light gun, revolver and shutter guns were recovered from them.

Five others were arrested on the first night of fresh anticrime drive launched across the district on Wednesday night. The clashes took place at Shibhu Market of Fatulla, Masdar and Charargop areas.

Processions were brought out in the town and adjoining areas yesterday rejecting the arrest of the criminals.

State Minister for Home Lutfozzaman Babar during his visit to the town on November 11 had given green signal to the police to nab the criminals. He asked the police to free the district of terrorism within a month.

Sources further said police prepared a list of more than 200 criminals and drug peddlers.

Vehicles urged to avoid cantonment roads on Nov 21

All vehicles except those carrying cantonment residents and the invited guests have been requested to avoid the roads inside the Dhaka Cantonment area from 6am to 10am and 4pm to 9:30pm on November 21 on the occasion of Armed Forces Day.

The decision has been taken with a view to keeping the roads inside the cantonment (from Shaheed Jahangir Gate to Staff Road of the main road) free of traffic jam on the occasion, said an ISPR press release yesterday.

A number of programmes have been arranged at the Dhaka Cantonment on that day.

Medical board formed to treat Shahriar Kabir

A five-member medical board of orthopaedics specialists has been formed for the treatment of noted writer and journalist Shahriar Kabir who was critically injured in a road accident in Saidpur on November 11.

Kabir's family members told The Daily Star yesterday that the board had examined him and taken a decision to make an operation in his right leg today.

The board also suggested sending Kabir abroad immediately for better treatment.

Meanwhile, General Secretary of Ektattur Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee Kazi Mukul, also injured in the accident, underwent a surgery in his left leg on Wednesday night.

The condition of Arup Singh Apu, a city leader of the Nirmul Committee, is still stated to be critical and undergoing treatment at the intensive care unit of the Metropolitan Hospital in Mohakhali.

Of the five injured, Kazi Biplob was released on Wednesday, while Sheikh Meraj Miju is undergoing treatment at the hospital.

SAIDPUR ROAD CRASH Judicial inquiry demanded

South Asian People's Union against Fundamentalism and Communalism (SAPUFC) yesterday demanded immediate judicial inquiry into the road accident in Saidpur on November 11 in which writer-journalist Shahriar Kabir and five leaders of Ektattur Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee were critically injured while another died.

In a statement, the SAPUFC leaders said the government made a plot to kill Kabir and others through a road accident.

They said the statement of Shahriar Kabir and subsequent attitude of police and other government agencies towards the victims, proved that the accident was pre-planned.

They said the government involvement in the incident was also proved from the fact that the Detective Branch of police pressed the family members of Kabir not to file any cases regarding the accident.

The SAPUFC leaders said after assuming the power the BNP-led coalition government harassed Kabir on many occasions as he is very vocal against fundamentalism and communalism.

They also expressed their deep sympathy to the family members of Abdul Hakim Pial who succumbed to his injuries following the road accident.

The signatories to the statement included Prof Kabir Chowdhury, Hena Das, Barrister Shawkat Ali Khan, Poet Shamsur Rahman, KM Sobhan, Mazharul Islam and Kalim Sharafi.

Saarc to fix its third decade's agenda in Dhaka summit: FM

Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan yesterday said the forthcoming South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (Saarc) summit was expected to fix its course reviewing the activities of the regional grouping in the past two decades.

"The Dhaka summit will add a new dimension to the Saarc fixing its new course for the 3rd decade of the regional grouping," he told newsmen at Zia International Airport as he embarked on a visit to

Nepal, the Maldives and Pakistan as special envoy of Prime Minister Khaleda Zia.

The foreign minister visits the three countries as part of his tour of South Asian capitals to hand over the official invitation of the prime minister to Nepalese Prime Minister Sher Bahadur Deuba, Maldives President Maumoon Abdul Gayoom and Pakistan Prime Minister Shaukat Aziz to attend the summit.

The foreign minister will also brief the Nepalese, Maldivian and

Pakistani sides on organisational preparation for the Saarc Summit.

He will seek their support for making the summit in Dhaka a turning point for Saarc by launching an era of implementation of commitments, promoting regional programmes and projects, and undertaking steps towards realising a vision of a South Asia Economic Union.

Earlier, the foreign minister visited India, Bhutan and Sri Lanka in this regard. He is expected to return home on November 26.

Concord Amusement World opens
