

'Buddha's teachings can establish peace'

Speakers at a discussion yesterday said the teachings of Lord Buddha could help establish peace and harmony in the strife-torn world of today.

They said Goutam Buddha was an exponent of peace and never supported any war or violence.

The discussion was organised by Bangladesh Buddhist Federation to mark the month-long holy Kathin Chibar Dan, a religious festival of the Buddhist community, at the

International Buddhist Monastery in the city yesterday.

"We must follow the teachings of Lord Buddha when the world leaders are engaged in bloody wars and conflicts in different parts of the world," said Dharmarakkhit Mahathero, vice-president of the federation.

He said enmity and unlimited greed for wealth can never bring peace.

Prof AK Feroze Ahmed of Dhaka University said the principle of tolerance and non-violence must be followed to establish peace.

S Asian Gateway portal on science, tech launched

An exclusive South Asian Gateway of the website of the London-based Science and Development Network was launched yesterday to provide online information on science, technology and development.

The gateway was launched in New Delhi on the occasion of a day-long workshop on 'Science, Communication and Society in South Asia', organised by the Science and Development Network.

Until now there was one gateway for the entire South and East Asia on the organisation's website and this had been split into three from Friday, one each for South Asia, South East Asia and China, said Network Chairman Dr Geoff Oldham and Director David

Dickson.

The South Asia gateway, www.scidev.net/southasia, would serve all the Saarc countries, including Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bhutan and the Maldives, and offer online news and dossiers on global developments in the area of science and technology.

The Network, launched in 2001 with funding from aid agencies and support from science journals Nature, Science and Third World Academy of Science, has become a leading source of online news and articles on science and technology.

Besides, this organisation has been holding workshops and conducting programmes for capacity-building. As a part of this initiative, the workshop in Delhi brought

together science communicators, policy-makers and development experts to address various issues concerning effective science communication.

Dr. RA Mashelkar, director general of Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, India, inaugurated the workshop.

He underlined the need to keep politicians informed of the science and technology-related developments and their benefits to society in order to secure more investment for research and development programmes.

The participants discussed the challenges faced by science communicators, the role of science journalists in socio-economic development and the steps to reach research results to policy makers.

Abducted Sylhet magnate yet to be rescued

Eid this year was no good to the family of Habibur Rahman, as police could not yet rescue the Sylhet magnate though a month has passed since he went missing.

Owner of Al-Rahman Trading Company of the city's Kalighat area, Md Habibur Rahman has been missing since October 17. His brother Rafique Uddin lodged a general diary with the Kotwali Police Station the next day. Later on 21 October, he filed a case that was transferred to the Detective Branch (DB) of police after two days.

A DB official, meanwhile, has ruled out the possibility of any criminal gang's involvement in the missing incident. He instead suspected some of the family members including the two wives of Rahman who might have a hand in the abduction. Especially, matters pertaining to property might be the cause, he said adding police would soon solve the mystery.

The DB police are now looking for a former upazila chairman, a close relative of the victim, on suspicion of having link to the 'abduction', said sources.

Police officials on several occasions claimed to have

made significant headway with the investigation. Police arrested nephews of the victim, Emad and Ashok, and former driver Manzurul Islam in this connection on 22 October. They, however, failed to extract any significant information from the arrestees despite taking them on remand twice, said sources.

Both the wives of the victim have accused the police of torturing the nephews, who they (wives) claim to be innocent.

Two days after the incident, unknown callers told the victim's wife Sultana that Rahman had been in good condition. Sultana claimed she could hear the voice of her husband over phone.

The Deputy Inspector General of Police (DIG) and Superintendent of Police in Sylhet had visited the house several times and assured the family of taking steps to rescue Rahman.

Different trade bodies and organisations including the ruling BNP have condemned the abduction. Traders in Sylhet had enforced a half-day strike in the city's wholesale market and formed a human chain demanding immediate rescue of the businessman.
