Taiwan targets \$3b investment in 6yrs

Investors say 8 companies ready to rush in

Taiwan eyes Bangladesh as a potential business destination with an investment target of \$3 billion for the next six years, a visiting Taiwanese delegation said here

"Seven to eight companies are ready right at this moment for investment," leader of the delegation Chii-Ming Yiin, also Taiwan's vice minister for economic affairs, told a press conference.

The delegation, drawn from 54 Taiwanese companies, arrived in Dhaka Sunday night on a three-day visit to explore trade and investment opportunities. They opened a two-day "Business Matching Meeting" at Sonargaon Hotel just before the press conference.

Yiin pointed out that the small group wants to invest rapidly, but their efforts would be a bit delayed for lack of readily available plots of land with ready utility facilities.

The plots in Dhaka Export Processing Zone (DEPZ) have

Yiin, however, expected that they would be able to invest around \$100 million, mostly in textile sector, by the first quarter of 2005. He said their total investment target is \$1billion by year 2007 and \$3 billion

Taiwanese entrepreneurs have already invested \$100 million in the fiscal 2003-04, according to an unofficial account, which Board of Investment (BoI) records show as

"Investment depends on improved infrastructure and environment. More and more Taiwanese investors will come here for investment if these are ensured," the

delegation leader told a questioner.

"Because," he added, "you have a very high productive people. They are friendly." He went on to praise the locals, saying that the delegation members feel more comfortable here than in India where they just concluded a visit.

"This is a very good time for Bangladesh to attract investment already exhausted, they were from Taiwan because mainland

China is running with shortage of power and shortage of workforce," the Taiwanese minister told the

reporters.

Besides Bangladesh's advantage in manpower, EPZ facilities and investment-friendly environment, the country has a very good advantage in terms of market access to the developed countries -- a facility the investors would like very much.

He also cited an 'aggressive policy' pursued by the Board of Investment, the official agency of Bangladesh for investment promo-

Replying to another question, he said Taipei does not need to have any diplomatic relation to promote trade and investment in a country. "We don't have diplomatic relation with countries like Vietnam and Thailand, but we've a very good business with them. Business is

The government Saturday cancelled ongoing recruitment of around 20,000 class three and four employees under district administration in the wake of widespread allegations of political influence, irregularities and corruption.

Highly placed sources said some top-ranking ruling party leaders cum cabinet ministers in the last two days tried to persuade the prime minister to revert the Saturday's decision.

They said the senior and influential ministers took up the issue to the prime minister at repeated request of their cabinet colleagues, lawmakers and other party leaders.

Convinced by a quarter, the prime minister took the decision without consulting any of her

EU agrees on military units for world crisis

EU defence ministers agreed yesterday to create 13 so-called battle groups, military units which can be deployed rapidly to crisis situations around the world, the EU's Dutch

The 1,500-strong tactical groups, which will put flesh on long-standing EU plans to have an independent military capacity, will be able to be deployed within 15 days.

One unit will be up and running by next year, while all of them should be operational by 2007.

"The European Union has

entered a new stage in the process of strengthening military capabilities for crisis management," said the EU presidency in a statement at a meet-ing of EU defence ministers in

"The battle groups are at the forefront of capability improvement, providing the Union with credible, rapidly deployable, coher-ent force packages capable of standphase of larger operations."

France, Italy, Spain and Britain have each agreed to form one unit, and all other EU states have agreed to contribute to at least one group, said Dutch Defence Minister Henk "It seems that we should be able

to have enough battle groups to including having an initial capacity in 2005 and full capacity in 2007," said EU foreign policy chief Javier "That shows that we all agree on

the importance of this project," he said, while noting that some details still remain to be hammered out, including decision-making arrange-He warned that such arrange-

Sunni cleric, GI killed in Iraq

4 more bodies of Iraqi soldiers found

AFP, Mosul

A senior Sunni Muslim cleric was killed yesterday in a drive-by shooting in the northern city of Mosul while a US soldier was killed in a late night attack in Baghdad.

Gunmen in a vehicle shot Sheikh Faidh Mohammed Amin al-Faidhi as he was leaving a place of worship in Mosul's Al-Rifaq district at around 9:00 am (0600 GMT).

"The cleric was shot four times in his chest and abdomen, and died shortly after he was transferred to hospital," said Abdel Jabbar Mohammed, a doctor at Medinat al-Tebhospital.

The cleric was a member of the Council of Muslim Scholars -- the top Sunni Muslim authority in Iraq and the brother of the organisa tion's spokesman in Baghdad, Mohammed Bashar al-Faidhi.

"A Task Force Baghdad soldier died from wounds sustained in an attack at about 10 pm (1900 GMT) on November 21 in southwestern Baghdad," the statement said with-

outelaborating.

The latest death brings to 1,215 the number of US troops killed in Iraq since the March 2003 invasion of the country, according to Pentagon figures. Earlier four more bodies, at least

three of them Iraqi soldiers, were found in the past 24 hours by the US military in the restive northern city of Mosul, a US army officer said on Monday.

"We found them at 2300 (2000 GMT Sunday), they had been dead for at least a couple of hours and their bodies set against the sidewalk, shot in the head and hands tied, Lieutenant Colonel Michael Kurilla told AFP, adding that three of them were confirmed as being Iraqi sol-

The bodies were found near the Al-Yarmuk roundabout, an insurgent stronghold in western Mosul, and brought to 15 the number of Iraqi soldiers thought to have been executed by rebels in Iraq's third largest city over the past two days. SEE PAGE 11 COL 6
