seeks Dhaka's

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh has expressed hope that Bangladesh and Myanmar will help India deal with the northeastern Indian insurgent outfits allegedly operating in those countries.

"We've made separate representations to Bangladesh and Myanmar to provide us assistance in dealing with north-east based militant groups in those countries," Singh told reporters in Assam's capital Guwahati on the second day of his visit to the state.

He said Myanmar in particular has assured India that it would not allow insurgents its (Myanmar) territory to use against India.

Singh's comments came after Assam Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi

## Local demand pushes gas export issue back

Mosharraf admits hasty deals with IOCs

Surging domestic demand for gas has defused the pressure to export gas but is compelling the government to strike hasty deals with international oil companies (IOCs), says State Minister for Energy and Mineral Resources AKM Mosharraf Hossain.

To meet the demand, the government recently started buying 25 million cubic feet per day (mmcf/d)

gas from Feni gas field that was developed by Canadian company

Niko Resources along with Bapex

under a joint venture agreement.

But the price has not been fixed yet.

And on November 8, Petrobangla

had to sign an agreement with US

company Unocal for gas supply

from Bibiyana. Under this deal

Unocal can stop gas supplies if Petrobangla fails to pay for the gas in due time.

Both these cases are unusual but the demand hike has forced the government to go ahead with them, the state minister says.

On the brighter side, the pressure for gas export is gone and the World Bank (WB) and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) have jointly given assurance of \$1.5 billion assistance for preparing a 20-year gas sector strategic plan. "Appointment of a consulting firm for preparing the strategic plan is now at final stage," Mosharraf disclosed.

In recent times, Indian giant Tata

Rab's help to get textbooks in time



## Pak PM flies to India for peace talks

APP, New Delhi

Pakistan Prime Minister Shaukat Aziz arrived in New Delhi yesterday for talks on Kashmir with Indian leaders after earlier playing down a spat over the scope of their peace talks.

Aziz, dressed in traditional Pakistani formal dress, was received at the airport by Indian Foreign Minister Natwar Singh.

He drove straight to the Taj Mahal hotel in the heart of the capital's Central Vista where he was scheduled to hold talks with the foreign minister yesterday.

Aziz, who is on his first visit to India, is scheduled to meet Prime Minister Singh on Wednesday for regional and bilateral talks, as well as

an assessment of the peace process

began in April last year when then-Indian premier Atal Behari Vajpayee offered a "hand of friendship" to Pakistan.

A fresh disagreement broke out last week over the talks between the two nations, which have fought two of their three wars over Kashmir.

"My visit tomorrow will improve the atmosphere of relations between the two countries," Aziz said in Colombo Monday. "The relations have improved considerably... It is very sportsmanlike across the board."

In an interview with the BBC, Aziz noted that Pakistan and India have in the past year restored air, road and rail links as well as cultural

## GSP perk to go as Dhaka drags foot

As Bangladesh has not implemented the Saarc Cumulation yet, it is still uncertain whether Bangladesh would be able to avail of the Super Regional Cumulation (SRC) facilities that of the European Union offers under its Generalised System of Preferences (GSP), commerce ministry officials said yesterday.

The recent guidelines issued by the European Commission on the GSP scheme for the 10-year period (2006-2015) encourage regional cooperation as a means for achieving greater improvement, benefit and utilisation of the GSP rules of origin by southern countries.

Sri Lanka has already prepared a concept paper on the SRC and is pursuing it to be included in the Saarc (South Asia Association for Regional Cooperation).
