

# Micro-credit changes lot of poor women in Magura

## Two NGOs revive lost glory of cottage industry of Chhonpur and surrounding villages

Two poor women changed their lot when two NGOs came forward to their rescue by lending them loans.

The women are Nabiron and Khurshida. Once life was miserable to them. Timely intervention of two NGOs, Srijoni and Jagoroni Chakra made their life meaningful.

Fortune smiled on Nabiron, an abandoned housewife and mother of a son at Chhonpur village in Magura Sadar upazila when Srijoni trained her and offered her a loan of Tk 8,000 in 2002. Making good use of the loan, she setup a bamboo-based cottage industry on the land of her father. She started making bamboo-made traps to catch small fish called 'Ghuni'. She used to make a fish trap at a cost of Tk 15 and sold it at Tk 35. Every Thursday she began to supply her product to wholesalers from her house at the rate of Tk 3,500 per hundred traps. The whole-sellers supplied her products to Faridpur, Rajbari and Chittagong districts.

'Now I earn Tk 3,000-4,000 each month and my son Shafiqul is attending school', smiling Nabiron told this correspondent. With the profit she also built a tin-shed house this year.

Once Chhonpur and surrounding villages were famous for bamboo-based cottage industry, according to Aminul a villager. But due to shortage of capital and lack of patronisation, the cottage industries were ruined, he said.

At present the lost glory of the villages were revived due to initiatives of Srijoni. One hundred twenty women at Chhonpur village are engaged in manufacturing bamboo-made fish traps. Some other women like Nabiron named Morzina, Aleya, Asmani and Farzana also became solvent by making such fish trap.

Another woman, Khurshida of the same village also became wealthy when Jagoroni Chakra, another NGO intervened about two years back.

Two years back the poor housewife and mother of three children had to live in extreme poverty. Because her rickshaw-puller husband could not feed his family of five members with his meagre income.

Jagoroni provided her with a micro-credit of Tk 10,000. Utilising the credit she also started manu-

facturing 'Ghuni'. Now her monthly earning rose to Tk 4,000 per month. She told this correspon-

dent, with her savings she got her eldest daughter married to a man of her choice this year.

## Seven die of diarrhoea in Comilla

Seven persons died of diarrhoea at Chaddagram upazila here last week. At least 200 others were attacked by the disease which broke out in an epidemic in 20 villages, according to eye-witnesses.

The dead victims are Sumi, 14, daughter of Omor Ali of village Bashkera, Holofa Begum, 35, mother of five children and wife of Ladu Miah of the same village, Jakir Hossain, 7, son of Abdul Ghofur of village Dakra, Abul Hossain, 8, son of Nowab Ali of village Gidi Kara, and 3 other children of village Baherghang in the upazila.

The villages are Baskara, Atakara, Komardoga villages in Kankopoth union, Karpoti in Batish union, Dakra, Darkota, Bhakarghara, Bangphaia in Munchirhat union, Kadoir, Ballachi in Shovapur union and Gididkora Sharpoti in Cheora union in Chaddagram upazila.

As diarrhoea is spreading fast in two villages of Bashkara and Dakra, severely, milad mahafils are being held in large number in the local mosque.

Fifty diarrhoea affected patients were admitted to Chaddagram Health Complex in last seven days.

## AL leader arrested

An Awami League (AL) leader was arrested for possessing counterfeit notes on Monday.

The arrested person is Shalikh Thana unit president of the party Israyeel Munishi.

Acting on a tip-off, a police team led by the Shalikh Thana Officer-in-Charge (OC) raided his house at Arpara village on Sunday night. After conducting a search of about half an hour, police recovered 17 fake notes of Tk 100. Later, he was sent to jail.

Sub-Inspector Abdul Hakim filed a case with Shalikh Thana under Special Power Act of 1974.

Israyeel Munshi said the case was a conspiratorial one, filed with a political motive by his opponents to harass him.

## A healthcare clinic with a difference

### FPAB clinic at Patuakhali renders service to poor patients at a nominal cost

A clinic of Patuakhali branch of the Family Planning Association of Bangladesh (FPAB) has been rendering healthcare services successfully to poor people at a nominal cost.

Since its inception in 1981, the clinic rendered healthcare services to 80,000 patients till date. It was set up on a land donated by Patuakhali municipality on the College Road in the town.

Because of its unique service, it

was selected as the best NGO in Barisal division in 2000-'01 fiscal.

Md Selim, District Project Officer of FPAB said to this correspondent the clinic has modern equipment where poor people specially women and children can get healthcare services. A physician trained in women and child diseases attends patients regularly.

'Anybody can get treatment from this clinic by paying only Tk 20 as registration fee', according to Dr Tahmina Khanam Siddiqua, Medical Officer of the FPAB. Medical tests of

urine, stool and blood pressure are done without any cost, she added.

Poor patients also get medicine free of cost from here.

Since 1981, about 23,787 married couples adopted various birth control methods, according to the physician.

The organisation is being run by a 15-member executive committee. About 15 officials and workers conduct the activities of the organisation while 102 workers work here on voluntary basis under the project.

## Woes of passengers at Mymensingh Railway Station

### Booking clerks doing brisk business by selling tickets at higher rate

Passengers suffer much due to malpractice being pursued by booking clerks at Mymensingh Railway station for a long time.

They are allegedly doing a brisk business by selling 'return tickets' with seat facilities, according to allegation of passengers.

When anyone wants a ticket with a seat, they regret it initially. If he/she offers extra charge, they come forward with a big smile, said Abul Hossain, a Dhaka-bound

passenger at the station.

The clerks usually demand extra charge, according to crisis. During heavy rush of passengers, the clerks are found to charge an extra amount for tickets, said another passenger Siddiqur Rahman.

While visiting this correspondent found all the computers of the station out of order in the railway station.

However, a source at the station said pilferage of tickets from computers increased during Eid season. The irregularities are going on unabated because many employees are working here for 10 to 28 years', according to an official of the station.

## Ras festival of Monipuri community tomorrow

## Land dispute: 20 hurt in B'baria

### Youth killed in Magura clash

A youth was killed and 10 others were injured in a clash at village Koomkhali in Shalikh upazila on Tuesday. The victim is Rabiul 30, son of Mesher Biswas. He died while undergoing treatment at Magura Sadar Hospital. Police and local people said, the clash ensued between rival groups of villagers led by Moshir Rahman and Ruhul Molla over damage of crops of a field, injuring 11 people. Both the groups used lethal weapons and sticks during the clash. Of the injured Rabiul, 30, Rafiqul, 35, Belal, 22, and Mosharaf Biswas, 40, were admitted to Magura Sadar Hospital while others were admitted to Shalikh upazila Health Complex.

### Pilferage of power transformers up

Pilferage of electric transformers and wire of Moulvibazar Pally Biddut Samity (PBS) is increasing alarmingly creating sufferings to electricity consumers. According to PBS official and customer sources, 17 transformers and 1,200 feet electric wire were stolen from different areas under PBS distribution line during last three months. Separate cases were filed with different police stations, but the criminal act is continuing unabated. While reinstalling new transformer, the Samity is demanding 50 per cent price of it from them. It has increased consumers' woes. However, Moulvibazar PBS officials told this correspondent that consumers are also member of the Samity. As per rule of Samity, members will compensate during new reinstallation.
