The ICC that came into being on July1, 2002 is a permanent and independent judicial body created by the international community through adoption of the Rome Statute in 1998 to prosecute four particular crimes like genocide, war crimes, crimes against humanity, and aggression.

Though Bangladesh happened to be the first country in South Asia to sign the Rome Statute in 1999, it has been ever since reluctant to ratify the statute in absence of strong political commitment, the speakers said.
