A fortnight-long international film festival will begin in the city tomor-

Prime Minster Khaleda Zia will inaugurate the 2nd International Film Festival Bangladesh as chief guest at Osmani Memorial Auditorium with BFFS Chairman MM Rezaul Karim in the chair.

Bangladesh Federation of Film Societies (BFFS) is organising the two-week festival with the assistance of Bangladesh Producers and Distributors Association, Bangladesh Film Exhibitors Association, Bangladesh Chalachitra Grahak Sangstha and International Federation of Film Societies.

The theme of this year's festival is

'Filmfor everyone'.

A total of 115 films of 41 countries will be screened during the festival.

Organisers of the festival at a press conference at the Dhaka Club vesterday said the exhibition would take place in four phases. In the first phase, from December 2 to December 9, the films will be shown in the Central

Public Library Auditorium, National Museum Auditorium, Russian Cultural Centre and Star Cineplex of Basundhara City.

The second phase will be on screen from December 3 to December 9 at 20 cinema halls in Dhaka and

The third phase will start from December 4 and continue till December 8 at Shishu Academy while the last phase will begin on December 10 in Chittagong, Khulna, Rajshahi, Sylhet and Barisal. The carnival will continue till December 16.

Festival Director Golam Rabban Biplob read out the written statement at the press conference. Chairman of the BFFA MM Rezaul Karim, Muhammad Jahangir, Ashraf Uddin Uzzal, Masud Parvez and Habibur Rahman were present.

There are four prizes to be given under four categories. The categories are International Federation of Film Societies (IFFS), Network for Promotion of Asian Cinema (NETPAC), Lifetime Achievement Award and Audience Award.

Political empowerment a must to ensure women's rights

Without political empowerment, it is quite impossible to ensure the rights of women in the society, said the

speakers at a workshop yesterday.

The three-day workshop titled 'Gender equality: A global challenge' was organised jointly by Khan Foundation and British High Commission at a city restaurant.

Minister for Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Moudud Ahmed attended the workshop as Moudud said there are constitu-

tional laws to remove the gender disparity. Besides, the provision for 45 reserve seats for women in parliament would also encourage women leadership, he added.

The minister laid emphasis on social awareness to remove the disparity adding that women education can playan important role in this regard. British High Commissioner to Bangladesh Anwar Choudhury said economic empowerment as well as the change of attitude and mindset are needed to eliminate gender

disparity.

Mandana Hendessi, national

commissioner of UK-based Women National Commission, presented a study result on the condition of women empowerment in global

perspective.

She suggested political rights, capacity building programmes at grassroots level, education and a national commission for women for their political empowerment.

Dr Nusrat Amin of Dhaka University said nine laws were enacted in the country to prevent repression on women since 1980, but violence against them is not reduced. She said seventy percent of the incidents of women repression are

mmitted by their husbands. Presided over by Advocate Rokhsana Khondker, executive director of Khan Foundation, the inaugural session of the workshop

This is for information of all handicrafts manufacturers/exporters that with a view to increasing export of handicrafts from Bangladesh, Government is disbursing "Working Capital" to handicrafts manufacturers/exporters from Export Promotion Fund (EPF) of Export Promotion Bureau. Each genuine handicrafts manufacturer/exporter is eligible to apply to Export Promotion Bureau, Dhaka for Tk. 5.00 (five) lac maximum on fulfilment of the following prerequisites/requirements:
