## Talha surprise

### Mashud replaces Saleh as vice-captain

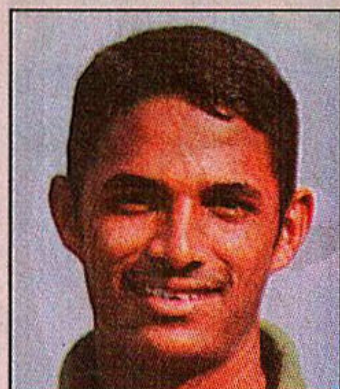

Fast bowler Talha Jubair was a surprise inclusion when the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) yesterday revealed its 13-member squad to face India in the opening Test of their two-match series as the home team dwelled on the prospect of playing a full-strength pace attack for the first time.

Fellow quick Mashrafe Bin Mortuza expectedly returned to the fold after convincing everyone that he had fully recovered from a career-threatening knee-injury which kept him away from all cricket for a year. 22-year-old Mashrafe has been virtually unplayable in the recently concluded Corporate Cricket League and also in the ongoing Dhaka Premier Division. However, Jubair's name as the third pacer behind Tapash Baishya was on nobody's mind as the 19-year-old had not made much of an impact since fighting his way back from a nagging back injury which also prevented him from playing for nearly two years.

The trio have never played a Test together but are widely regarded as

the three best pacers of the country. Chief selector Faruque Ahmed while announcing the team at a press conference, said the decision to take Jubair stemmed from India's prolific record against spinners.

"We have considered our opponents' strengths and the condition of the pitch. We thought pacers could be more effective than the spinners against the Indian batting line-up. We have also asked for a hard and bouncy track which also influenced our decision to keep three quick bowlers.

"Talha is a good Test bowler and we believe he can be effective in this series," explained Faruque.

Although left-arm spinner Enamul Haque (Jr.) was tipped to partner Mohammad Rafique, another left-arm spinner Manjural Islam Rana got the final nod for his ability with the bat although his inclusion in the final XI will depend on Jubair's playing status.

Pacer Tareq Aziz Khan and middle order batsman Alok Kapali were the two others apart from Enamul to be dropped from the 13 in Bangladesh's last Test which was against New Zealand in October.

Captain Habibul Bashar made a welcome return to the side. The only Bangladeshi with over 2000 Test runs, Bashar had missed almost all international cricket since September including the home Tests against New Zealand first due to an injury to

## Kumble, Laxman angry

Senior Indian stars Anil Kumble and Venkatesh Laxman have expressed their anguish at being ignored for an upcoming one-day series in Bangladesh.

"I don't want to sit and watch a one-day international. I want to be playing in the eleven," Kumble told The Hindu daily.

Kumble, 34, who holds the Indian Test record of 434 wickets jointly with legendary all-rounder Kapil Dev, was "rested" along with Laxman for three one-dayers in Bangladesh starting December 23.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India announced the team on Thursday saying Kumble was not keen to play while Laxman had been dropped because his fielding was not up to the mark for one-dayers.

"We have rested Laxman and Kumble in a bid to try some youngsters," board joint secretary Gautam Dasgupta had said on the last day of the second Test against South Africa in Kolkata.

But Laxman is far from happy.

"I know I was never spectacular but my level of fielding has not deteriorated. The same standard of fielding was good when it suited some people," he said.

Kumble is widely considered India's most potent weapon in Tests but has struggled to hold on to a place in one-dayers, most recently in a one-off match against Pakistan in Kolkata last month when he was restricted to the bench.

Laxman, 30, has not been a regular in the shorter game either

and was not part of the squad for last year's World Cup in South Africa.

"Why should I be rested? I never asked for any rest. I'm fit and as keen as anyone else. I'm very hurt with this treatment. Why do I deserve this?" Laxman said.

The pair can boast two of the best records for India in Tests.

Kumble became only the second bowler after famous England off-spinner Jim Laker to take all 10 wickets in a Test innings -- and that against Pakistan at Delhi in 1999.

Laxman hit an epic 281 when India were following on against Australia at Kolkata in 2001 to turn the match and series around.

In one-dayers, Kumble has 321 wickets from 259 matches while Laxman has 2,309 runs in 83.

Kumble and Laxman are part of the squad for two Tests that precede the one-dayers.

The first Test will be held in Dhaka from December 9 and the second match in the eastern port city of Chittagong from December 16.

The first one-dayer in Chittagong will be followed by back-to-back day-night matches in Dhaka on December 26 and 27.

## Eng complete whitewash

England bowled out Zimbabwe to win their fourth one-day international by 74 runs here on Sunday to complete a 4-0 series whitewash.

Veteran bowler Darren Gough took 4 for 34 as England bowled out the hosts for 187 having set them a victory target of 262.

Ian Bell showed there is more to him than just being an opening batsman as he wrapped up the tail with impressive figures of 3 for 9 while the only Zimbabwe batsman to offer stubborn resistance was Hamilton Masakadza, who made 66

before being bowled by Paul Collingwood.

Collingwood also accounted for captain Tatenda Taibu, who made 23 as he and Masakadza put on a 75 run partnership for the fifth wicket and rescued some respectability for the hosts after they had been reduced to 43-4.

England's innings had been built round a superb 150 run partnership by captain Michael Vaughan and Geraint Jones.

England were 104 for 5 when Vaughan and Jones got together and they excelled to notch up the third best partnership by a sixth-wicket pair in one-day internationals.

Vaughan scored 90 not out for his fourth half-century in his last six

one-day matches and his best ever total.

Jones made 80 while Zimbabwe bowler Edward Rainsford notched up 2 for 29.

England opener Matt Prior scored a brisk 35 on his one-day debut.

Vaughan played more of an anchor role than Jones who let fly with seven fours and two sixes in his 80 off 75 balls.

England had picked an untried side with Prior coming in for Vikram Solanki, Ashley Giles making way for Gareth Batty to make his first appearance in the series, and Gough was preferred to James Anderson.

## Kiwis mug Kasprowicz

Wicketkeeper Brendon McCullum and young batsman Hamish Marshall snatched an exciting victory for New Zealand over Australia in the opening match of the inaugural Chappell-Hadlee Trophy one-day cricket series with two balls to spare here on Sunday.

The Kiwis looked to have the job ahead of them needing 32 runs for victory off the last 18 balls, but the match swung decisively when McCullum and Marshall plundered 22 runs off the third-last over, bowled by Michael Kasprowicz.

In a twinkling the asking rate plummeted to 10 off 12 balls which McCullum and Marshall achieved without problems for New Zealand's first one-day victory over the world champions in their last eight meetings.

Marshall, left out of New Zealand's two-Test drubbing by Australia, hit a defiant unbeaten 50 off 52 balls with one four and McCullum cracked 20 off 13 balls to give the beleaguered Kiwis a morale-

boosting win.

"It's pretty damned good, considering the last two or three weeks, they've been pretty tough as they usually are when you come to Australia," Black Caps captain Stephen Flemings said.

"It's a nice change of fortune through some good cricket and I'm pleased it sets up a series we think pretty highly of."

Australian captain Ricky Ponting said Australia let the match slip after twice being in a strong position -- at the start of its innings and in the field, where two crucial catches went down.

"But in saying that we still probably should have won," he said. "We all make mistakes, Kasper's (Kasprowicz) bowled a few ordinary deliveries in that over but we're certainly not blaming him."

"The whole fielding side of it was pretty sloppy. The bowling was very good, we just didn't back them up in the field."

New Zealand had restricted Australia to 246 for nine off their 50 overs after early Adam Gilchrist fireworks and although the Kiwis were 128 for one in the 32nd over they appeared to lose their chance

with a tumble of wickets.

Fleming was out leg before wicket off the second ball of the innings from Brett Lee, but Nathan Aspinall (70 off 102 balls) and Mathew Sinclair (48 off 86) had the Black Caps in contention with a 128-run second-wicket partnership.

But the Aussies hit back with Darren Lehmann removing Aspinall and Scott Styris (5) and Kasprowicz had Jacob Oram caught behind for 25 leaving the Kiwis struggling at 189 for five in the 44th over.

Big-hitting Chris Cairns lasted 11 balls for 14 before Lee bowled him with a Yorker leaving the Kiwis at 208 for six when McCullum came out to join Marshall.

Earlier, left-arm spinner Daniel Vettori and medium-pacer Cairns claimed three wickets each as they put the clamps on Australian scoring in the middle of the innings.

Vettori claimed 3-31 from 10 overs and sparked a collapse with the wickets of Ponting (29), Damien Martyn (1) and Andrew Symonds (0) to reduce the home side to 123 for five.

Darren Lehmann (50), Michael Clarke (36) and Brad Hogg (20 not out) led the Australian recovery, but
