Another dies in Rab action

An alleged criminal was killed in a 'crossfire' between his accomplices and the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) on the city protection embankment

in Mohammadpur yesterday.

The elite force nabbed Jahangir Alam alias Dipu, 23, in Jigatola at around 4:00pm Tuesday, said Rab sources. He was later questioned about his hidden firearms at Rab-2

Following his statement, a Rab team took him to the embankment ground to seize the arms at around 4:30am.

A Rab press release said Dipu's men opened fire on the anti-crime force, which at once retaliated.

As Dipu made an attempt to escape, he received five bullets and died on the spot, the release added. The Rab seized a single-shooter gun with two live and one spent

bullets from the spot. The Rab and other sources said

Freeze on Aid to Bangladesh

Dutch govt to contest court ruling next week

The Dutch government will contest by next week a Dutch court ruling on Monday for a freeze on the Dutch government's development aid funds to Bangladesh worth 30 million euro or Tk 242 crore a year.

A Dutch company, Tulip Computers, won a case at a Dutch court for an embargo on the Dutch government funds to Bangladesh under international law, as Bangladesh refused to pay the company 4.2 million euro in damages over a contract cancelled last year.

The Royal Netherlands Embassy in Dhaka confirmed the court ruling to The Daily Star Tuesday night but

said, "The Dutch government has decided to appeal against the court verdict. We will sort out how much money is involved in the verdict by this weekend and we will inform the government immediately."

A Dutch court in February compounded the Bangladesh government's worries after it ruled the cancellation of a contract to run an IT project here as illegal. It also ordered the government to pay 4.2 million euro or Tk 33.8 crore as compensation for investments already made for the project by Tulip, as reported by www.theregister.com

"We are very disappointed at the verdict. But we are sorting out the

specifics of the impact of the court ruling," said a Dutch embassy diplomat, preferring anonymity. conflict, however, is one between the private party, Tulip Computers

and the Bangladeshi government."

A high official of the foreign ministry, however, told The Daily Star on Tuesday they are still in the dark about developments on the matter and are unaware of any freeze on Dutch aid funds.

According to EU laws, if court order is not followed, ocean- and air-liners carrying Bangladesh flag would become liable to confiscation in European Union (EU) countries. In December 2000, the

Giant pvt satellite earth station gets going May

Multimedia communications anticipate huge boost

The country's largest private sector satellite earth station would goes into operation from May next, significantly boosting the existing facilities for local and overseas data and multimedia communications.

DNS SatComm Satellite Earth Station, which also is the country's single largest ICT infrastructure project, will be built through a syndicated loan and equity financing from the central bank at Savar

SatComm Chief Operating Officer Atiqul Ahsan told The Daily Star

The total project cost has been estimated at Tk 16.24 crore. Of that Infrastructure Development Company Limited (IDCL) would provide Tk 4.88 crore, and Janta Bank and Prime Bank Limited Tk 2.43 crore each as loan. Of the rest, Equity and Entrepreneurship Fund of Bangladesh Bank would provide Tk 3.18 crore as equity and the

Export Processing Zone, DNS remainingTk3.32 would be invested by DNS SatComm.

A contract signing ceremony will be held in this regard on December 14, with Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman and Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission (BTRC) Chairman Syed Marghub Murshed present as the chief and the special guests.
