# 50pc households landless

6.2pc families own 40pc land

Over 50 per cent of the total households in the country are landless while only 6.2 per cent families own 40 per cent of the total land.

General Secretary of Bangladesh Economic Association (BEA) Prof Abul Barkat revealed the data at a working session on 'State, Society and Governance' at the 15th Biennial Conference of the association in the city yesterday.

He said that 12 crore people is directly or indirectly involved in land cases, of which 75 per cent are related to land dispute. It takes nine and a half years on an average to settle a land related case.

The persons involved in land cases lose assets worth Tk 12,520 crore a year while only one per cent of annual expenses on land cases worth Tk 24,860 crore goes to state

Prof Barkat said some 90 per cent of the total one crore bigha khas land of the country is grabbed by crimi-

# 'Ensuring human rights a must for peace'

Speakers at a seminar yesterday called for taking rational and effective steps to protect human rights as it is interrelated with the development of the country

They made the call while addressing a national human rights seminar organised by Bangladesh Human Rights Commission (BHRC) on the occasion of the 56th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights at Caritas auditorium

in the city. Addressing the seminar as chief guest, Speaker Jamiruddin Sircar said ensuring human rights is a precondition for peace.

Ensuring fundamental rights to food, clothes, education, medicare and shelter is a must for establishing human rights in true sense, he

Sircar also decried war, calling it a curse as it grossly violates human rights and destroys society.

Deputy Opposition Leader in parliament Advocate Abdul Hamid said the major cause of violation of human rights was the "overtaking process" as most individuals and professionals like to go ahead in life overtaking other people through

illegal means. He strongly criticised the government for what he said killing people in 'crossfire' bypassing the judicial

"Killing people in crossfire is a violation of human rights," he said.

Senior National Advisor of the BHRC and UNB Chairman Amanullah Khan presented the keynote paper at the seminar, chaired by BHRC president Kazi
