Scoring a Test century is always something special. I'm really delighted with the hundred because I missed out just for four runs in Kanpur against South Africa," said the Delhi left-hander, who scored 139 off 196 deliveries.

He also said that it was always enjoyable to play with a batsman like Rahul Dravid.

"It was a great pleasure for me that I was accompanied by a bats-man like Rahul. I was a little nervous in the 90s like any other new bats-man in the world, but finally I overcame it," said Gambhir.

On the other hand, Dravid praised the wicket however he was not ready to blame the local bowlers. "I think they (bowlers) initially

bowled very well and worked very hard the entire day but it was difficult to earn success from this kind of track which was absolutely suited the batsmen," he explained.

"I believe it is very difficult to get out a batsman if he concentrates during his innings. Initially, I wanted to settle down in the middle and later it got very easy for me to bat on this surface," he added.

The 31-year-old Indian vicecaptain, who completed his 18th Test hundred, said that he was not thinking about a double century but rather wanted to bat for the team. "I don't know what will happen

Earlier, the visitors failed to add any run to their overnight 322-9 as their first innings folded in just three deliveries in the morning.


Although Shahriar Nafees hit a

Australian captain Ricky Ponting opted not to enforce the follow-on Friday after a disastrous day of undisciplined cricket saw Pakistan humiliated on the second day of the first Test at the Western Australian

Cricket Association ground. The tourists plunged to 179 at the end of their first innings -- still 202 runs behind Australia's first innings total of 381 and three runs short of avoiding the follow-on.

Instead Ponting decided to bat again and after three overs his team were 15 for none at stumps with openers Justin Langer not out on three and Matthew Hayden on

But already there was more bad news for Pakistan after star bowler Shoaib Akhtar limped off the ground

halfwaythrough his second over.
It was he and fellow paceman
Mohammad Sami who had provided the only bright spot in a terrible day for Pakistan with a dour ninth-wicket stand of 60 which took 176 balls to build. After a shaky start in their open-

ing session, losing the opening pair of Salman Butt and Imran Farhat for 45, Pakistan then lost six wickets

after the lunch break for just 60. Shane Warne and Michael Kasprowicz feasted on the slovenly antics of the Pakistan batsmen to finish with figures of 3-38 and 5-30

Warne in particular was delighted to see the wickets of allrounder Abdul Razzaq and Mohammad Khalil fall to his guile as

they attempted outrageous swipes. But it was Younis Khan, who had come to the crease with the score at 45 for two and had settled the innings slightly with a measured 42,

that started the rot.
Younis had already seen his captain Inzamamul Haq bowled by Kasprowicz straight after lunch for one and Yousuf Youhana caught behind off the same bowler for the same score to see his team reeling at

There were nervous whispers circulating around Chittagong that Bangladesh pacemen Mashrafee bin-Mortuza and his debutant new ball partner Nazmul Hossain had suffered worrying injuries on Day One of the second Test against India

However, the Tigers' manage-ment ruled out anything serious. Manager MA Latif said Mashrafee, who received a knock on his right-knee while fielding and Nazmul, who could not finish his 17th over

because of cramps, were okay.

"Both are very well now. They had a little bit of problem but nothing to be concerned about," Latif told the Daily Star Sport.

Mashrafee, easily the best Bangladesh bowler in the two Tests, has had a history of knee injuries and only returned to playing last month after a year out of cricket.

After getting hit by the ball, he was seen limping for a while which brought back dark memories of November 2003 when he broke down in the middle of the second Test against England at this very
