will always be remembered as the match where Ashraful inspired his side to show what they are capable of if they play to their potential. Single-handedly he earned respect for his country that had been so elusive and when he reached that magical three-figure mark before tea, everyone at the ground stood up to applaud his genius including those in the Indian dressing room and a delighted Ravi Shastri in the ESPN studio -- a rare sight which every Bangladeshi young hopeful should replay in their dreams and try to emulate in the future.

It took over three years for Ashraful to live up to the standards he had set on debut. He was still not 17 when he made world cricket history by becoming the youngest Test centurion on debut against Sri Lanka in September 2001. But he had remained a young prodigy since showing only fleeting signs of bril-liance before finally giving a full exhibition on Sunday of what he is capable of

Ashraful's 158 not out in the Bangladesh first innings was unique because it was celebrated beyond the boundaries that separate the two nations involved in the battle.



From Aminul to a genius

For the last four years Aminul Islam held the record for the highest individual Test innings for Bangladesh. His epic 145 in the Inaugural Test against India in November 2000 looked unbeatable until Sunday afternoon when an irrepressible Mohammad Ashraful crossed that landmark at the MA Aziz Stadium in Chittagong.

It was unfortunate for Aminul that he could not even see Ashraful's magnificent 158 not out on television as live telecast of the second Test between Bangladesh and India was not available in Sydney, were the former national captain now resides with his family.

But Aminul could feel every pulse racing through the player he fondly called his 'little brother'.

"It's really unfortunate I could not see the moment because in Sydney ESPN was not available. But I have followed his innings ball-byball via the Internet. I was astonished at the pace by which Ash raced from 60 to 90. And when he reverse swept Harbhajan Singh I could feel there was no stopping him," said Aminul while giving his reaction to The Daily Star over phone yesterday.

"I would have loved anybody in the team going past my mark but the fact that Ashraful did it fills my heart with special joy. I have seen him grow up in front of my eyes and I never had any doubt about the talent he possessed. I believer he will be the first Bangladeshi batsman to score a double hundred, said Aminul who congratulated Ashraful afterwards.

"He (Ashraful) sent me an SMS after breaking my record. But I have been trying to reach him by phone for hours," said the right-hander who finally was able to talk to the new record holder late last night.



Paceman Glenn McGrath recorded the second-best bowling figures by an Australian in Test history to power the home team to a whopping 491-run win over Pakistan on the fourth morning of the first Test in Perthon Sunday.

Resuming at 18 for one chasing an unlikely 564 for victory, Pakistan had no answer to McGrath, who took eight for 24 on a bouncy WACA pitch as the world's top-ranked side bowled out the tourists for 72 to claim a 1-0 lead in the three-match

The only Australian to better McGrath's performance was spinner Arthur Mailey, who picked up nine for 121 against England in Melbourne in 1920-21.

Sunday's victory by Australia was the fourth-highest winning runs margin in Test cricket and Pakistan's innings was their fourth-lowest total in Test history.
"The conditions are suited to fast




