Latif hopes to make int'l return

Former Pakistan captain and wicketkeeper Rashid Latif said Wednesday he hoped to revive his international career after the Pakistan Cricket Board reduced a six-month ban and cleared him for selection.

The PCB in a statement on Wednesday said that after Latif appealed the ban and after considering the facts, it had reduced the ban to

Latif, 36, was banned from all cricket for six months after he led the Karachi team on a walkout to protest a dangerous pitch in a first-class match

at Faisalabad last month. He was also fined 251 dollars.

"Latif had appealed against the ban and the penalty imposed on him, stating that proper procedures had not been followed in the subsequent inquiry and that he had publicly regretted the incident of the match and explained his reasons for abandoning the match," the PCB said.

"After reviewing all related issues and considering Latif's standing as a former captain, the PCB has decided to reduce the penalty to one months suspension from first-class cricket from the date of the incident," the PCB

"Latif would be eligible for selection at all levels after the expiry of one months suspension."

The ban expires on January 1, which leaves Latif eligible for selection for Pakistan's one-day squad due to be announced next week

If there is one player who can help us to forget the unromantic realities of modern soccer forget that what we are watching is now little more than business, forget that players have no passion for the game, just inflated egos and salaries, forget the lurid scandals of player gang bangs, doping, racism then it is Ronaldinho, of FC Barcelona.

He reminds us that once upon a time the game was played for the

sheer joy of it... Ronaldinho's odyssey began, like many South American fairytales, in the slums. In this case, Porto Allegre Brazil's equivalent of the Wild West, hence his nickname Gaucho (cow-

This week, his journey from favela to footballing legend was completed. The Barcelona star won the FIFA World Player Of The Year

157 international coaches and 145 national team captains voted that Ronaldinho, in first place with 620 points, Thierry Henry, in second with 552, and Andriy Shevchenko, third with 253, be recognized as the three greatest footballers in the world this year.

Amazingly the Brazilian received the award despite having won nothing with Barcelona during the year in question and having missed Brazil's Copa America triumph last summer.

He becomes the fourth Brazilian to have won the award since it's inception in 1991. Romario (1994) was the first recipient. Ronaldo came next, filling his mantelpiece with the 1996, 1997 and 2002 editions. Rivaldo felt left out so they gave him one too, in 1999.

Ronaldinho started his career at unfashionable Gremio, Porto Allegre's club, in 1998, following a spectacular contribution to the Brazil under-17 side's participation in the World Championships in Egypt, where he was top goal poacher.

Soon enough he got into the national side and at the 1999 Copa America he even managed to score six goals as Brazil went on to win the damn thing! A star was born, the goofy grin was everywhere and Europe's top clubs waved their cash at him from across the Atlantic.

Suitably for such a jolly young man, 'gay' Paris was to be the next destination, in the summer of 2001. The club Paris St Germain. A legal wrangle over his contract prevented him playing for his first five months in the French capital. Paris St Germains' initial loss was

Brazil's eventual great fortune. In the summer a well-rested Ronaldinho took the 2002 World Cup by storm. By now he was a key piece in the Brazil jigsaw, alongside Ronaldo and Rivaldo.

In the quarter-finals, Brazil met a miserly England defense, bolstered by the veteran goalkeeper David Seaman, one of the hottest shot-

stoppers in the world and with a lovely pony-tail to boot.

Michael Owen scored a surprise breakaway goal for the English, having pounced on a Lucio mistake, then Rivaldo pulled one back with a neat finish and just after half-time Brazil were awarded a free kick a long distance out, wide right of the England goalmouth.

Q: What do an Elephant and Ronaldinho have in common? A: They can both lob Seaman

Ronaldinho swept the ball high into the humid Sapporo air, it swirled, it curled and in came back down to earth, beyond Seaman's

outstretched hand and into the net. The impossible goal took Brazil to the semi-finals and Ronaldinho to world superstardom. Fluke or not, the goal was of paramount importance. Brazil went on to claim their fifth crown against a wretched Germany in the final and Ronaldinho was named one of the

players of the tournament. In 2003 Barcelona's president-

elect Joan Laporta was basing his prospective candidature on the signing of a superstar, but was rebuffed by first-choice David Beckham. Laporta turned his attentions to Ronaldinho, object of Man United's affections.

After four years in the wilderness, surely Barca couldn't compete with the likes of Man United? But Laporta, to the amazement of the soccer world, got his man. Ronaldinho's choice of Barcelona ahead of United was a moral victory for the club and paved the way for a turn-around in its affairs.

On his home debut in the 2003-2004 campaign in front of a wildly expectant Nou Camp, Gaucho announced himself in samba style. He won the ball on the half-way line, danced past defenders and spanked a thirty-yarder in the top corner. Catalunya fell for him on the spot.

His first campaign as a blaugrana restored the club to the top two and helped attract players of the pedigree of Deco, Eto'o, Larsson and Giuly to join. The delirious Catalan press referred to him as 'The Savior' This season, with Ronaldinho's

help, Barca have returned to their best form, have been hailed as the greatest attacking team in Europe, are top of their league, and have already whipped arch-rivals Real Madrid 3-0.
