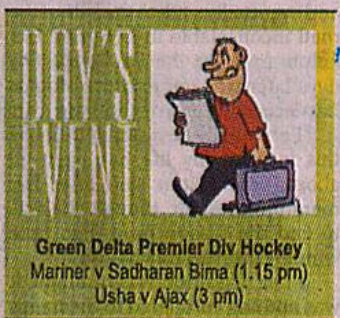

Batting for a change

Bangladesh's batting finally shrugged off its notorious blues at the MA Aziz Stadium on Thursday. Although the Tigers lost the first of the three-match one-day series against India by 11 runs, but for a change the boys of Dav Whatmore showed that they could chase a target and chase it really hard.

The home team scored 234 in reply to India's 245 in their 99th appearance in the shorter-version of the game. Interestingly, it was the first time in nine matches Bangladesh have gone past the 200-mark in an ODI after scoring 221-9 against minnows Hong Kong at this year's Asia Cup in Sri Lanka.

Skipper Habibul Bashar led the Bangladesh fightback with gritty 65 and young Aftab Ahmed kept his nerve under pressure with an aggressive 30. But it was a sensational half-century 39-ball 50 from wicketkeeper Khaled Mashud and some lusty blows by another experienced player Khaled Mahmud that propelled Bangladesh past 200.

And had the start been a bit more positive and Mohammad Rafique not been magnificently caught by

Yuvraj Singh at point, the finish could have been even closer.

Still, going into their 100th ODI at the Bangabandhu National Stadium on December 26, Bashar was happy with his side's performance against the formidable Indians in Chittagong yesterday.

"We know that we cannot win overnight. But by bringing down the margin of defeat today we have achieved our first target. If we can carry on like this in the second match we can dream of winning in the third and final game against them. What we always need is a gradual progress and I'm happy with our effort today," the 32-year-old told reporters after the match.

When asked where his team lost the battle while chasing on a wicket that turned more batting friendly after lunch, the Bangladesh captain said that the problem lies in the middle-order.

"We have some weaknesses in the middle-order. But despite the slow progress in the middle I hoped that even if the required run rate was around nine or ten our strong lower-order batsmen were capable of pushing the Indians at the end," said Bashar.

He however did not want to say much about the sluggish approach of his opener Nafees Iqbal, who

scored a painstaking nine off 52 balls before being carelessly run out. Nor did he comment on the non-performance of Rajin Saleh and all-rounder Mushfiqur Rahman.

Bashar was more than happy with the effort of his bowlers, who at one stage had the Indians reeling at 45-3.

"The three pace bowlers in the team especially Nazmul Hossain bowled really well to contain the vastly experienced Indian batting. Tapas might have conceded a few runs in the final overs but that always happen when everybody throw their bats around," Bashar said.

Sourav Ganguly also praised Bangladesh's fightback.

"I think that they competed well. To be honest when it looked like we are winning easily they really gave us a scare, said the most successful Indian captain.

"With 44 runs needed to win it was clear that they were already out of the game but somehow they took 32 odd runs in the last two overs and that set the game up nicely," said Sourav.

Both teams will now return to Dhaka to play the last two games under lights at the Bangabandhu National Stadium on December 26 and 27.

Agrani falter again

The Green Delta Premier League resumed yesterday after an eight-day break without any upsets but promotes

Agrani Bank, the surprise co-leaders at after fifth rounds, crashed to their second successive defeat.

City Club looked set to bury their wretched start in the 12-team fray when the last year's joint runners-up stormed to a four-wicket victory against Agrani at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium in one of the day's three matches.

Victoria Sporting Club recorded their fifth consecutive win to stay on top of the table after six rounds when they beat Young Pegasus by 51 runs while Bangladesh Biman handed bottom-of-the-table Uttara Sporting Club a 70-run defeat for their fourth win.

CITY CLUB-AGRANI BANK Agrani, who tasted their first defeat at the hands of Abahani in the previous match, could not recover from a severe collapse and ended on 155-8 in 50 overs after being put into bat.

Left-arm medium-pacer Ashraf Khan, coming into the attack as first change, grabbed five for 29 to destroy the Agrani batting in a deadly 10-over spell. His victims included top-scorer Golam Mabud, the opener who made 39 off 67 balls to give the bankers a solid start.

Comfortably placed at 50-1, Agrani lost five wickets in a span of 18 runs before the tail halted the landslide.

City also suffered a hiccup on way to their fourth win but opener Mehrab Hossain Junior's 57 and stand-in captain Tushar Imran's unbeaten 40 steered them to the target with more than six overs to spare.

Mehrab Jr, who hit four fours in 128 balls, shared 48 runs for the opening stand with Pakistani

Majeed Saeed but big names like Mehrab Hossain Opee (1) and Moniruzzaman (1) were dismissed cheaply.

Tushar, leading the side in absence of Khaled Mahmud, then steadied the innings during an 80-run fourth wicket partnership with Mehrab Jr. Tushar's 62-ball knock was laced with three boundaries.

Ashraf was adjudged man-of-the-match.

VICTORIA-YOUNG PEGASUS

Opener Gazi Salahuddin scored 69 and Pakistani Fahadullah made a quickfire 40 off 43 balls as back-to-back league champions Victoria scored 237 before being booked in exactly 50 overs at the BKSP ground in Savar.

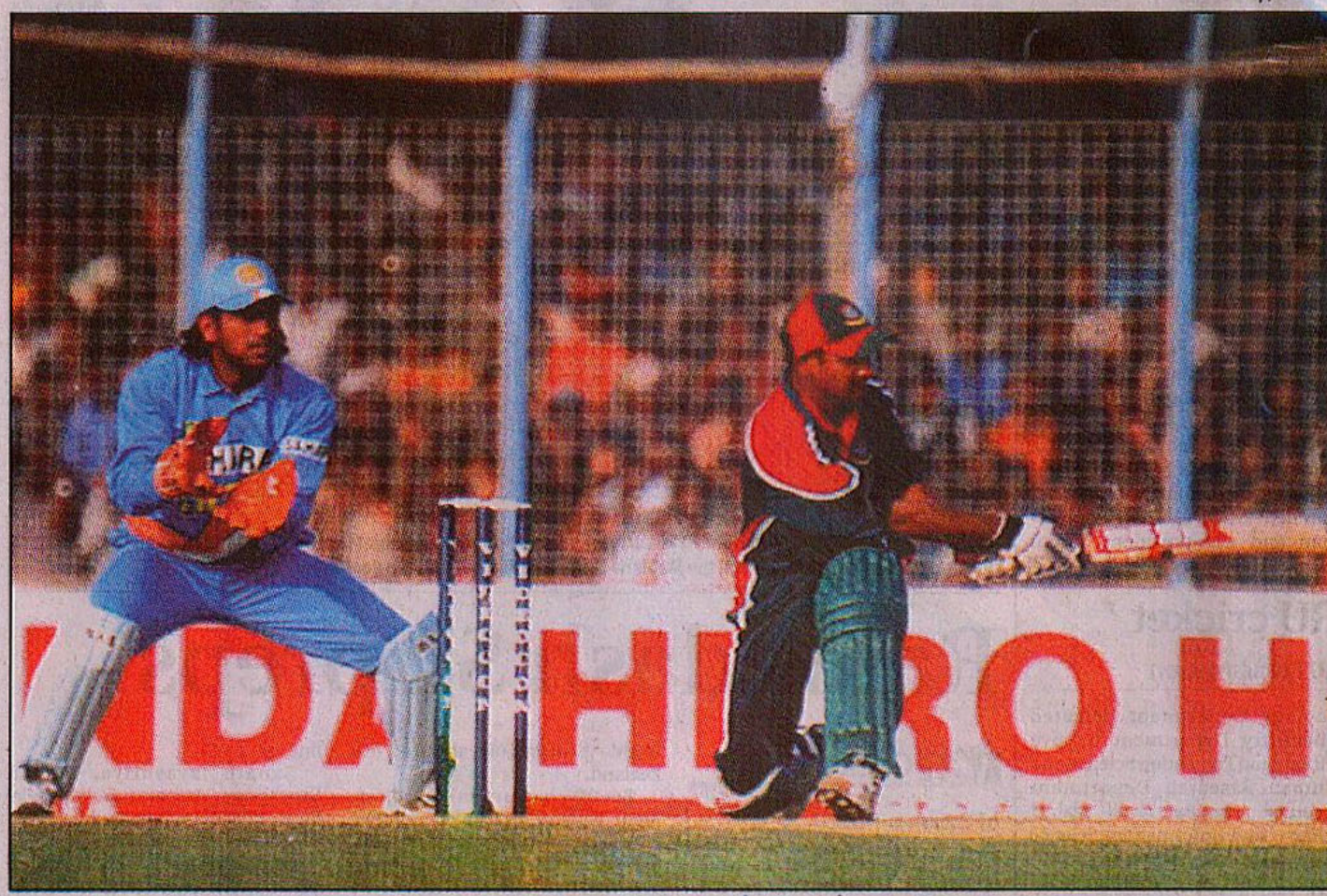
Sri Lanka international Kumar Dharmasena arrived in Dhaka yesterday to play for Abahani in the ongoing Premier Cricket League.

Abahani overcome Sonali Bank

'Shoaib a showman'

Australia fast bowler Glenn McGrath says Pakistan paceman Shoaib Akhtar is a showman whose main goal is simply to bowl quicker than anyone else in Test cricket history.

"Without a doubt, that's Shoaib," said McGrath, who has just regained his ranking as the world's best bowler.

"My goal has always been to be the best bowler in the world, not so much the quickest."

"I'm sure Shoaib's major and only goal is to be the quickest bowler in the world, if not of all time."

Pakistan lost last week's first Test in Perth by 491 runs. Shoaib took six wickets but was criticised for taking more than six minutes to bowl an over and for tiring after short spells.

Pakistan coach Bob Woolmer said this week he had given up on attempts to convince Shoaib to shorten his run-up.

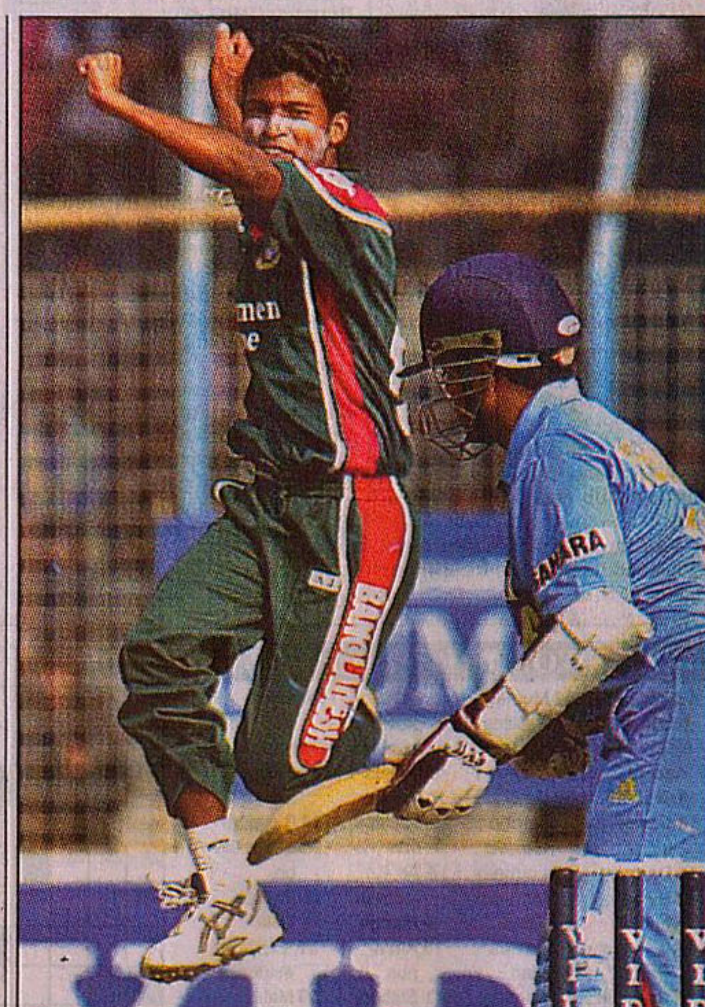
