# **BDR foils** push-in bid

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) foiled an attempt by the Border Security Force (BSF) to 'push-in' 36 Bangla speaking people from India to Bangladesh on Chanduria border in Kalaroa upazila Sunday.

BDR sources said the BSF's Gobra Company had gathered the people together to push them into Bangladesh

After the attempt failed, the BSF proposed a talk between the two sides that was held near pillar No. 15 at zero point. The hearing on the petition is likely to be heard today by an HC bench comprising Justice MA Matin and Justice AFM Abdur Rahman.

The BSF during the talks alleged that 36 Bangladeshi nationals from Bagerhat crossed the border and were arrested by Indian police a few months back. They also asked the BDR to take them in.

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education yesterday asked the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB) and the Ministry of Education to explain the ambiguities about historical facts in school textbooks.

The committee at a meeting decided to seek an explanation after a heated debate over who had proclaimed independence and the

date of the proclamation and other distorted facts' in some textbooks published by the NCTB, the textbook regulator.

Opposition legislator Shahjahan Khan blamed the ruling coalition for distorting the coun-try's historical facts in textbooks and misleading future generations. He asked the committee mem-


