Fokhrul's 12th solo exhibition

Simplifying life in black and white

BOUT Fokhrul Islam, who is having his 12th solo Lexhibition at Alliance Française, Raffaele Grossi, a wellknown Italian painter said that, it reflects great talent and promise. It has extraordinary sensitiveness, said Patrizia Guiotto. Del Guidice and Petra Wiess, who also saw his work in Italy, praised it for its richness and for having used only one

Speaking about his own work, Fokhrul says, "I'm not trying to prove my skill but am expressing my feelings, emotions and love in the simplest of ways. You cannot measure love or affection so I cannot pass judgement on my work. If my work touches your heart even in the slightest of way, it shall be my gain. There is no fixed time for his

work, Fokhrul says. "I have my moods and drives and follow them, whatever the time of the day. I work with press ink, mustard oil and soya bean oil on paper. I like black and white because they surpass all colours and express my feelings of nostalgia and memories in the least complicated way. I've brought in landscapes with broken houses, crumbling old walls, windows, arches and pillars. When I toured Italy and India, I saw a lot of remnants of old, decaying and crumbling buildings that spoke of the past civilizations and I tried to capture them in my lines, curves, dashes and swirls. I have brought in temples, churches, houses and halls that are crumbling and speak of a glorious past.

the plank of wood I show life when it is in balance and out of balance. My work also reflects the tensions in life and nature. It also symbolises the tension in everyday socioeconomic life. The moon is seen behind other images such as circular lines." Thus Fokhrul has dealt with everyday nature's beauty too, in the simple black and beige strokes. Similarly, he has brought in trees with their leaves and branches in a new compelling way of dots and dashes.

In "Image-3", oil on paper, we see a massive cluster of trees with their tall slim trunks and hundreds "When I deal with the ball and of leaves done in beige and black.

In front are the dark, restful shadows. The same subject is brought in "Image-4", oil on paper, only it has the leaves falling in front as well as gathering in clouds, scattered on a bright, clear sky at the back. Interlacing sweeps of black lend depth to the creation. "Image-9" has houses and trees, nestling into one another, the houses seen in sweeps of delicate lines and the trees being covered with splashed black dots. The sky above is clear and sets off the subject as do the gray sweeps in

the forefront.

and gray with delicate tracing of lines going through. His other works bring in forms that we see on the barks of trees and in dried pods of seeds, once again in black, yellow and white. "Images 7 and 8" bring in layers and sweeps of black, white, beige and gold as one might see in the interiors of rain forest. Fokhrul has studied for two

years in Beijing, China, and has studied under various foreign visiting teachers in Dhaka like Sussan Benton from USA, Adreana Hernandez from Denmark and H Gercke from Germany. He has exhibited in Japan and India and has an award from Goho, Japan.

do respect her habit of writing just like I appreciate her acting very much. She knows how the sequences run from one to another. So, she elaborately describes the whole scene with the directorial terms and details, which is very helpful for the actors and director," says Ejaz Munna, actor-director, talking about his wife Tazin.

According to the glamorous actress Tazin Ahmed, "Munna is a good critic of my acting. He always appreciates the spontaneity in my performances."

Tazin Ahmed stepped into the entertainment world in 1996. Previously she was a regular artiste in the theatre groups Theatre (Arambagh), Natyadal and Aranayak. Later, she became a familiar face on small screen for her performance in the drama serial Shat Paure Kabya. At present she is a popular face in both television and theatre.

Ejaz Munna, an actor-cum-director, began his career as a theatre activist in 1988. He took to heart the suggestion of light director Taposh Sen and took theatre as a profession. His guru Mamunur Rashid told him to join the visual media. Munna wrote and directed a drama serial for Mamunur Rashid's pro-

duction house, Bangla Telefilm. Since then he has been working with different prominent people and production houses. As an actor he came to the media in late 1980s and as a director he started with the drama Not Out. The Ejaz-Tazin duo are busy with two forthcoming mega serials--Ek Akasher Tara and another yet-to-be-named drama serial.

Ejaz Munna is a regular actor in theatre. He is at ease on stage because of the long-term rehearsals that precede a production. However, he is not comfortable in the visual media as he feels it is difficult to concentrate on many plays simultabe it is easy for artistes with higher qualification to convey a host of varied moods in the same shift. I am not comfortable with the directors asking me to give varied expressions within a few shots.

Tazin had decided to give more time to acting. However, she says she has little chance to do that because of the intrigues in the entertainment media. So, she has started to write TV plays.

About being each other's critics, Munna says that Tazin is very straightforward about criticism. As he says, "If I do anything monotonous or stereotyped, she would point this out without hesitation. But I usually have a positive approach towards her perfor-

Tazin emphasised that performers should try to avoid stereotyped performances. Another thing that throws a damper is the interference of the producers in guiding directors and dictating the composition of the cast. As a consequence, she says, "Some people who are ill informed about acting and directing are donning the role of producers."

Tazin sees the situation as a cycle. She says, "If the market expands, the sponsors will come forward and promote quality production; making room for

87th birth anniversary of the litterateur observed

On the occasion of the 87th birth anniversary of litterateur Shawkat Osman, recitation group Shwanan organised a cultural and discussion programme at the Liberation War Museum, Mondaylast.

Reminiscing the writer, chief guest of the programme poet Shamsur Rahman said, "We owe many things to him which nobody else could give us. Although his main expertise was in short stories and novels specifically in the satiric genre, he also had creativity in writing poems." To comment on the creations of

Shawkat Osman, professor Anisuzzaman said, "He generated social awareness through artistic but clear and straightforward messages in his creations. We will remember him not only for his creativity but also for his commitment for the society--the commit-



ment towards life to make it more meaningful and special."

The eldest son of the author, Bulbon Osman recalled many incidents related with his father and elaborated on his boldness. He said, "His ready wit and firmness in sticking to his principles was envi-

able." Bulbon recalled that his father used to tell them, "It is not important what you have but who you are". "And that was the guide-line of bringing up his children," Among others literary personal-

Celebrities unite to raise tsunami aid funds

Veteran pop star Sir Cliff Richard, flamboyant singer Boy George and other British musicians plan to release a song to raise money for victims of the devastating Asian tsunami, the tune's composer said. Robin Gibb of the Bee Gees and opera singer Russell Watson were

Radio DJ Mike Read wrote the song Grief Never Grows Old before the December 26 disaster, but said he was now getting stars on board to release it within weeks.

charity singles have proved hugely popular fundraisers in Britain, where the reworked Band Aid 20 charity single Do They Know It's Christmas, featuring Dido, Jamelia and other stars, recently spent several weeks at the top of the charts.

Separately, managers at the Millennium Stadium in Cardiff, Wales--the largest indoor arena in Europe--said they were planning a charity concert at the 74,500-seat venue on January 22-23, and hoped to raise more than 1 million pounds (\$1.92 million) for tsunamistricken Asian countries.

Britons, haunted by images of the disaster, have donated up to 1 million pounds an hour in the country's fastest ever charity appeal. The

government's donation of 50 million pounds has been dwarfed by the 60 million pounds given by the public. Hollywood opened its wallet to survivors of

the tsunami disaster as movie stars Sandra Bullock and Leonardo DiCaprio donated big sums to relief agencies and NBC planned a celebrity-studded TV benefit. The American Red Cross said it received a

\$1 million donation from Bullock for tsunami relief in South Asia and East Africa. The star of Miss Congeniality and Speed previously donated \$1 million to the Red Cross in the anermain of the September 11 attacks DiCaprio pledged a "sizable" contribution

to UNICEF, targeted for aid to devastated areas of Thailand, where his 2000 film The Beach was NBC and its sister cable networks--USA

Bravo, Trio, Sci-Fi, MSNBC and CNBC--plan to simulcast a benefit special on January 15 featuring celebrities and musical perfor-

Meanwhile, a benefit concert to raise funds will be held in Prague on January 9. The concert at Lucerna music hall will feature many of the country's top rock and pop stars, all of whom will perform free of charge. All profits will be sent to the Indonesian embassy in
