



#### One to die, 2 others get life

A court here yesterday sentenced one person to death and two others to life term imprisonment in the sensational Roxi murder case of Brahmanbaria.

Judge M Hasan Imam of the Divisional Speedy Trial Tribunal gave the verdict at a crowded court room at Liberty Tower in the city in presence of the accused.

The convict with death is Alal Mia while the persons sentenced to life term imprisonment are his brothers, Jahangir Mia and Kamal Mia. The lifers were also fined Tk 20,000 each, in default, to suffer one year's Rigorous Imprisonment (RD.

The judge in his verdict said that Roxi, a student of class three, was killed by accused Alal following a dispute over property with the victim's father.

The court acquitted four other accused -- Jalal Mia, Runu Begum, Rabeya Basri and Chan Bibi -- of

According to the deposition of the case, Roxi, son of Abu Bakar Siddiq alias Rocket Member, was kidnapped from his village home at Beparipara under Sarail upazila in Brahmanbaria on September 21,

Five days after the abduction, the decomposed body of Roxi was recovered from a well in the neigh-

The victim's father Abu Bakar Siddiq filed a case accusing Alal Mia and six others of the same family in

The court gave the verdict after cross-examinations of 25 witnesses,

## Skop threatens strike for Feb 12

Skop will hold a rally on January 15 at the Muktangaon in the city demanding payment of their wages and bonuses before Eid-ul-Azha. Thousands of workers also held a

rally yesterday at the Muktangaon demanding the implementation of an agreement they reached with the government on January 10, 2004.

Their demands include forming a minimum wage board, renegotiating salaries and benefits in line with current market prices, ensuring trade union rights, reopening closed factories, ending privatisation and taking initiatives to make ailing industries

Leaders of Skop urged the govern-ment to take effective steps for saving

the country's industries and factories. "The government said it would implement the agreement by May 2004, but it has failed to do so even up until today," said Dr Wazedul Islam Khan, Co-ordinator of Skop.

The government is closing down local industries in order to meet the
