

## Govt puts administrator at BGMEA

Move seen as attempt to control the association before elections

The government yesterday appointed an administrator to replace the executive committee of the largest trade association of Bangladesh following a court ruling.

Many believe the move is nothing but an attempt of the government to clamp down control on Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) with only a month to its election.

A court order, which took the BGMEA leaders by surprise, directed the Director of Trade Organisation under the commerce ministry to appoint an administrator.

In the wake of the court order on January 3, the government appointed Joint Secretary of Industries ministry Mohammad Ayub Miah to take over charges "immediately" and conduct election of the new office bearers within the next six months.

The administrator has also been directed to run daily business of the association whose members directly employ 18 lakh workers.

Sources said one MA Masud filed



RU recruits stage rally, sit-in

The controversially appointed 546 employees at Rajshahi University (RU) yesterday held a rally and staged a one-hour sit-in in front of the RU administration building demanding immediate confirmation of their jobs and two months' salary before the Eid-ul-Azha.

They also brought out a procession on the campus and chanted slogans in support of their demands and against the university authorities.

The rally warned of a 'mass agitation' from Sunday to realise the demands if they are not met by that time.

Chaired by Newly Recruited Employees' Interest Preservation Committee Convenor Rafiqul Islam Sadar, the rally was addressed by Akkas Ali, joint convenor and Masud Rana.

## ACC to ask for wealth statements of VIPs

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) soon will ask the VIPs and the rich including ministers, lawmakers, bureaucrats and business leaders to furnish their statements of wealth and property.

The commission is going to set up a cell to collect, keep and update the statements of the VIPs and the rich to begin with, to be followed in respect of people of other walks of life.

A commissioner will be in charge

of the cell to be equipped with most modern gadgets.

The statements will be made public by posting them on the ACC website, sources said.

The groundwork for the cell has already commenced but the ACC is yet to finalise the details and its mode of operation, they added.

Soon after taking charge, ACC Chairman Justice Sultan Hossain Khan and member Maniruddin Ahmed on November 23 disclosed their plan to gather the statements.

To ensure its own accountability,

before collecting others' wealth statements, the ACC also asked the Bureau of Anti-Corruption (Bac) staff who had been working at the commission since the bureau's dissolution to come up with their statements in one month's time.

"You don't have the moral right to ask others to disclose the details of their wealth and property if you don't do it yourself first," observed a source at the commission.

But, though the deadline passed on December 24, the ACC chair and

PBCP leader killed in 'crossfire'

A regional leader of outlawed Purbo Banglar Communist Party's (PBCP) M-L faction was killed in 'crossfire' between police and his accomplices in Gilatala under Khanjahan Ali thana yesterday.

Iqbal Hossain alias Shaikat, 38, accused of seven murders and several other criminal offences, was arrested from KD Ghose Road Wednesday.

Police said Iqbal was killed in 'crossfire' when he made an attempt to flee with the help of his accomplices. He was taken there to seize his arms and ammunition, they added.

A swan-off rifle, three bullets and four bombs were seized.

Meantime, Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) Wednesday arrested an NBCP cadre from opposite Palli Bidyut office in Batiaghata upazila.

Chitta Ranjan Gain, son of Monohar Gain of Rajaband village in Batiaghata, is a charged sheeted accused in several murder cases. The Rab handed him over to Dumuria police yesterday.



Benapole strike continues for sixth day

Stalemate at Benapole land port yesterday continued for the sixth day amid holding of protest meetings and processions by the five striking organisations of the porters.

Leaders and activists of the organisations held rallies and marched in processions in the main thoroughfares of Benapole.

Acting president of Clearing and Forwarding (C&F) Agents Association Shamsur Rahman described the government's decision to reduce charges by 50 percent as an eyewash. He said the proposed reduction is meant for charges other than those of the warehouses.

BNP meet sings Rab praises

There has been a marked improvement in law and order situation in the trouble-prone southwestern region following a crackdown on criminals by the government with an elite force, local BNP leaders said at a party grand conference here yesterday.

Appreciating the government for its move to deal with the criminals, they said a sense of security has been created in public minds as at least 24 outlaws were killed in police and Rab (Rapid Action Battalion) drives in the region. Seventeen of them were killed in the last two months.

The dead are Lance Corporal Mahmud and Sepoy Jahangir.

## 11 AK47s, ammo seized at Bandarban again

The Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) members yesterday seized another huge cache of firearms and ammunition, including 11 AK47 rifles, from Naikkhongchhari with the law-enforcers still clueless about rampant arms smuggling in the area.

With this arms haul, the paramilitary force retrieved a total of 26 AK47 and two M16 rifles, four mortars, eight light machine guns, one rocket launcher and more than 14,000 bullets in last one and a half months from the upazila.

Tipped off, a team of 40 Rifles Battalion led by Lt Col Hasinur Rahman, raided Chikonchhari area,

some eight kilometres west of Lambuchhari camp, at dawn yesterday and found a den of criminals after searching the area until 4:00pm.

The BDR members dug out the sophisticated assault rifles, 53 magazines, 1,506 bullets, 11 cleaning kits and 21 oil cans, sources said. But the gunrunners had fled the scene before the security forces surrounded the area close to Myanmar border.

The law-enforcers so far failed to arrest anyone in connection with the arms smuggling.

Arms and explosives experts of the army examined the arms. A team of US arms experts also visited Naikkhongchhari last January. But they could not find the origin of the arms as the smugglers rubbed out the brand and the names of the manufacturing countries.

In mid December last year, the BDR seized seven sub-machine carbines with 37 magazines, eight stings, 19 magazines, 10 .303 rifles, two locally made guns, four .303 rifle

## Two army men, 11 others killed in road crashes

Thirteen people, including two army personnel, died and 52 others were injured in road accidents in Gazipur, Sirajganj, Cox's Bazar, Satkhira, Rangpur and Faridpur districts yesterday.

In Gazipur, two army personnel died and 24 were injured, four critically, as a lorry carrying them back from winter exercises in Tangail skidded off the Dhaka-Tangail highway and fell into a ditch in the morning, according to the UNB.

The critically injured were admitted to the hospital and the rest given first aid.


