'Quick changes, reforms can help resolve problems'

Joy, Kristine leave for US UNB, Dhaka

Bangladesh needs quick changes and reforms to resolve the varied problems, including corruption, and steer the nation to the path of development and modernisation, said Sajeeb Wazed Joy, son of Leader of the Opposition in Parliament and Awami League President Sheikh Hasina, yesterday.

"There are lots of problems here... If I get the opportunity, I will make Bangladesh a modern country where no-one will starve," he told reporters at the Zia International Airport before leaving for London en route to Washington.

Joy, who plans to come to Dhaka in March, said changes should be brought about and the country modernised. "The government can do it if it so wishes."

Replying to a question, he said that as his wife Kristine, a US attorney, is doing a job in America, he would not settle down here permanently but would frequently come to

"I don't have any ambition of becoming a political leader, nor any wish to make Sudha Sadan a second informal seat of power... My mother remains at the helm of politics and I will serve the country staying beside her," said the US-educated computer engineer.

Joy came here with his American wife, Kristine Overmire, on December 22, triggering specula-tions about his joining active poli-

Expressing gratitude to the people for showing their love and affection for him and his wife, Joy said: "I am grateful to them; I am very delighted. It was completely unthinkable for me." However, he expressed disap-

pointment that he could not visit his ancestral home at Pirganj in Rangpur. "My only sorrow is that I could not visit my home village. I could not perceive why the government had failed to give me security," Kristine said, "This is a nice

country and I hope I would see a more fantastic Bangladesh in
