#### 11 killed in Pakistan sectarian violence

At least 11 people were killed, six of them burned alive, during sectarian unrest yesterday in a northern Pakistani city where a curfew was imposed and troops were deployed to restore order, officials said.

The riots broke out in Gilgit after unidentified gunmen shot and wounded prominent Shia Muslim leader Agha Ziauddin and killed his two security guards, local administration head Sajid Balooch told AFP.

### Palestinians vote today for Arafat successor

Low turnout predicted for Hamas boycott call; Israel eases closures

overseeing the election.

Palestinians were mulling yesterday their choice of candidates to succeed the late Yasser Arafat ahead of a poll that looks set to be comfortably won by their historic leader's longtime deputy, Mahmud Abbas.

Public opinion polls have indi-cated that the result of today's vote is an all but foregone conclusion, with Abbas at least 30 points ahead of his nearest rival, independent candidate Mustafa Barghuti.

While Abbas appears in little danger of defeat, his supporters' main fear is that large numbers of voters will heed the call of the radical Islamist group Hamas and stay away from polling stations in only the second election for the head of the Palestinian Authority.

Candidates are officially barred from campaigning on Saturday and none have scheduled any rallies. Their supporters, however, are expected to continue canvassing

until the last possible moment. Abbas was slated to meet with the

former US president Jimmy Carter, one of the leaders of the hundreds of international monitors who are

In order to ensure the smooth running of the election, Israel has pledged to keep all its forces out of Palestinian towns and cities for a 72hour period from Saturday, in theory allowing the local population an opportunity to travel freely within the West Bank and Gaza Strip for the first time in years.

But Israel has placed severe restrictions on campaigning in occupied east Jerusalem throughout the campaign. On Friday, it kicked two candidates, including Barghuti, out of the holy city for allegedly violating agreements on campaign-

An Abbas victory is likely to be the signal for a resumption of toplevel talks with Israeli, frozen since Abbas walked out of a short stint as


Arafat's first premier in September

After arriving back in his base in Ramallah on Friday night, Abbas told reporters there was no option but to do business with Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon.

"Mr Prime Minister Sharon was elected by his people. We have no right to be asked for that to be changed... We have no other choice but to sit with him and we will do our best to convince him of Palestinian

Abbas said that he would ask current prime minister Ahmed Qorei to head up a new government and also voiced optimism about the prospect of persuading militant factions to sign up to a new truce. He managed to persuade all the armed factions to halt their campaign of anti-Israeli attacks when he was premier, but the so-called hudna fell apart after seven weeks.

### **Bringing** back from the brink

Species start breeding at JU wildlife centre

A number of endangered species brought to the wildlife rescue centre (WRC)on Jahangirnagar University (JU) campus three months ago have started breeding again.

The female otter of the Mustilidae family has given birth to three offspring, weighing 200gm each, on December 15 last year. They have been developing normally and even better than they would in the wild, the researchers said.

The offspring now weighing about 400gm are still too young to walk as they can't see yet but should be able to do so within three or four days. However, after the female otter conceived,

# Tamil Tiger chief goes missing after tsunami

Elusive Tamil Tiger chief Velupillai Prabhakaran and his intelligence chief Pottu Amman are among the dead or missing after last week's tsunami disaster, state radio said yesterday, sparking fresh tension between government and rebels who immediately denied the report.

The Island newspaper, meanwhile, reported Saturday that an expensive coffin "for a top LTTE leader" had been smuggled into a northern Tiger area inside a container carrying relief for tsunami

The LTTE, in a statement posted on its official Peace Secretariat Broadcasting Corporation for carrying the reports, saying now was "not the time for gossip mongering and malicious propaganda".

"The LTTE and the Tamil people wish to strongly protest against this mischievous act of the Sri Lanka Broadcasting Corporation, stooping down to such low level of broadcasting news that (is) fabricated by interested parties," the statement

"At a time of a national catastrophe of this magnitude, it is very ... regrettable that a responsible media of the government takes upon itself speculation that tend to create confusion in the minds of the peo-

The radio reports quoted a Vice Admiral Daya Sandagiri as saying Prabhakaran and Amman were among those killed or missing in the

Observers said, however, it would be difficult for the guerrillas to hide their leader's death and pointed out he had made a statement expressing sympathy for all those hit by the December 26 tsunami days after tragedy.

Prabhakaran directs the struggle for an independent Tamil homeland from a secret jungle base in the north-east of Sri Lanka and has a reputation as a fearless and ruthles guerrilla leader.


