# Fire tamed, but severe damage feared

The raging flames that had leapt 300 feet at Tengratila gas field in Sunamganj early Saturday subsided to 10 to 30 feet yesterday afternoon, indicating the fury of the inferno might be over much earlier than officials had predicted.

But geological experts said the gas field has probably been severely damaged 'internally'. A tremor had jolted Tengratila area at 5:00am on Saturday two hours before the fire broke out, they pointed out.

"The tremor indicates that faulty drilling by Niko Resources has done a lot of damage inside the 800-metre gas-well," an expert said. "It is likely that the uncontrollable pressure of gas in the well has forced a soil layer to fall. This did not happen even in the Magurchhara blow-out."

"This means a bigger gas reserve has been damaged in the internal landslide," he added

Locals said the area was jolted several times yesterday but not as severely as on Saturday.

Eyewitnesses said the roaring flames at the gas field shot up to more than 1,000 feet yesterday morning. However, the flames came down to about 80 to 90 feet by noon and further down by the evening.

The base of the fire however has widened. Fresh gas leakages were noticed at a number of points

The district authorities have asked over microphone all residents within a three square-kilometre area around Tengratila to move to safer

Niko started drilling in this abandoned gas field in December 2003 with a 1,700-metre target. But, it is alleged, the Canadian company did

not take proper safety measures and went on drilling up to 800 metres through the well that had only 300 metres of concrete casing


