Forgers use chemicals to erase designs of Tk 100 notes to turn them into Tk 500 ones

Criminals are now using special chemicals to erase the print on Tk 100 notes and then reprint them as Tk 500 notes. The security thread and water print are keptintact.

This novel way of forgery has made it difficult to detect counterfeit notes not only for members of the public but also for

Most of the banks in Dhaka

have machines to detect fake notes but these relatively cheap detectors cannot identify the notes now being forged using thenewtechnique


"We are getting fake Tk 500 notes almost everyday, some of which have security threads and water prints almost identical to that of Tk 100 notes," said Md Masudul Karim, senior staff officer at Karwan Bazar branch of the IFIC Bank Ltd.

The Security thread and its

thickness in both Tk 100 and Tk 500 notes are the same and both notes are of the same size, he pointed out.

Banks are now facing serious problems in receiving money from big clients as banks use machines to count the notes, Masudul said. "It is not possible to check all notes received in big

# 32 army men axed for timber theft

Rest of the gang - 15 forest men, 35 Ansars - await punishment

Thirty-two army men including a major have been fired and eight of them awarded with one-year rigorous imprisonment for smuggling timber in collaboration with 15 forest staff and 35 Ansars in the Kaptai region.

The forest men and Ansars are also facing the axe anytime.

Two separate inquiries by the Bangladesh Army last month found the army, forest and Ansar staffs involved in a recent timber smuggling from Alikhiang Forest Range under Bilaichhari Zone in Kaptai, highly placed sources at the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) and The Ministry of Environment and Forest

Eid to check price

The government is going to launch an Open Market Sale (OMS) of rice immediately after the Eid-ul-Azha in a bid to check its soaring price.

The government has not alternative to launching the OMS to bring down the price of rice, said a high official of the food and disaster management ministry.

Rice prices have risen by Tk 2-3 a kg in recent weeks. Such a rise is not supposed to take place just after the

Aman harvest, he pointed out. However, Siddiqur Rahman Chowdhury, secretary of the food ministry, claimed the price of rice is stable in the markets.

"Although prices are a little bit higher compared to that of last year, they are yet to become unstable," he

"We're fully prepared to start the OMS anytime if necessary to keep the prices in the market under control," the secretary added.


