Rajuk evicts Amtoli slum

Rajdhani Unnayan Katripakkha (Rajuk) yesterday evicted Amtoli slum in Banani turning a few thousands of people homeless.

The Rajuk started bulldozing the shanties of the slum in presence of Gulshan police and a magistrate at around 11:00 am.

Witnesses said the Rajuk knocked down a few hundreds of shanties and damaged household belongings of the poor slum dwellers without any prior information. Most of the residents could not remove their stuff, they added.

M Emadul Islam, superintend engineer of the Rajuk, said the slum dwellers had been living there for years and polluting the lake water.

They built many unhealthy open latrines by the Gulhsan-Baridhara lake and were polluting it by directly disposing excreta into it. That's why we evicted them as a part of our environment drive," he

The slum had also become a centre for criminals and police were also seeking an eviction, he

4 more Rab battalions

Each new battalion will have 688 manpower drawn from the armed forces, police, Bangladesh Rifles Ansar and Coast Guard, adding to seven existing Rab battalions with 5.500 manpower who are conducting anti-crime operations across the country, Rab sources said.

"The government is planning to

form the four more battalions to ensure deployment of necessary Rab members in all parts of the country," the sources said, adding that two of the new battalions will be placed in Sylhet and Barisal divi-

Of the existing seven battalions, four are based in Dhaka while one each in Chittagong, Khulna and Rajshahi divisions.

"We are working to prepare a proposal on manpower, equipment and management of the new

When one cent counts in global trade now with the phaseout of the multi-fibre agreement, the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI) yesterday asked the Chittagong Port Authority to take urgent short-term measures to lower charges and cut

As the port Chairman AMM Shakhawat Hossain detailed a number of steps including the underconstruction New Mooring Container Terminal and a planned deep sea port, a high-powered MCCI team felt that since these would take years and even decades to complete,

urgent measures are now needed. The leading chamber said imme-

diate start of customs clearance through Green Channel is one task that needs to be done. Reducing check and approval points of cus-toms and port from 42 to seven is another step. Other steps needed are allowing private inland container depots with permission to handle import containers, computerisation of port and customs operations and allowing door to door delivery of

MCCI President Kutubuddin Ahmed said goods need to be cleared within 24 hours at any cost. He suggested formation of a regulatory body for the port in the fashion

Stocks rallied spectacularly yesterday, a day after a huge slide, as the market regulators assured the investors of reverting to the margin facilities if share prices continue to fall.

The investors showed renewed interest and were in a buying spree yesterday after Tuesday's nosedive when the prices went down by more than five percent on average.

The Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) General Index on Tuesday shed 133.13 points, the largest-ever

The fire at Tengratila gas field is slowly dying down with the flames leaping less than five feet at three points yesterday, compared to around 10 feet on the previous day.

Gas continued to leak, however, at 30 points in and around the gas field yesterday. Bubbles of gas were still seen in the local water bodies, The Chittagong Stock Exchange (CSE) All Share Price Index gained and gas was also spewing out in the last three days at various points in 128.01 points to stand at 3355.25 the sand covered marshy lands.
