Top brass to get Tk 46,300; lowest staff Tk 5,896

Pay Commission finalises report; measures will need Tk 5,249 crore in addition

The top most civil servants should get Tk 27,500 in basic salary and those at the lowest rung Tk 2,800, according to the National Pay Commission which will submit its recommendations to the government by month-end.

This means a 57.87 percent rise for the top brass and 70.17 percent for those at the bottom from the

existing pay structure, according to commission sources.

When added with all allowances, the highest salary of a civil servant would come to Tk 46,300 and the lowestTk5.896.

The lowest salary has been fixed keeping in mind the calorie intake of a household of four persons. The new pay scale will take effect

Poor gas supply hits homes, businesses STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The gas-run industries and household users and gas stations in the capital and adjacent districts have been facing acute shortage of gas for the last few days due to shortfall in production against the rising

Meanwhile, against the backdrop of the crisis, the government has decided to increase the gas prices with effect from the current

The energy ministry has set the monthly tariff for a single burner gas oven at Tk 350 from its current price of Tk 340 while for the double burner it is upped to Tk 400 from Tk 390. Domestic consumers who use meters have to pay Tk 130 for every 1000 cubic feet of gas. The earlier rate was Tk 126. For power genera-tion the rate will be Tk 73.91 upped fromTk72.45.

Gas price for commercial use has been upped to Tk 233.12 from Tk 228.50. For the use of fertiliser industry the rate has been fixed at Tk 63.41 while for industrial use at Tk cubic feet of gas.

5,000 on-trial graft cases run into snags

ACC to serve letter on 22 more ministries about missing vehicles

Over 5,000 on-trial corruption cases filed by the former Bureau of Anti-Corruption (Bac) have run into snags, as former Bac officials are not appearing in court because of their present status as 'reserved government employees'.

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) is now supposed to run the cases after the dissolution of Bac, but it is facing difficulties due to the row between the government. and the ACC over the status of former Bac employees.

The commission is considering seeking urgent government directives to continue the cases

The ACC will, meantime, send a letter tomorrow to 22 more ministries asking them about several

thousand missing vehicles. It has also begun investigation plaints including three in the mobile rules and regulations and declared

monopoly Bangladesh Telegraph and Telephone Board, the shipping ministry and the forest department. The government yesterday withdrew Reza-e-Rabbi who it

appointed as ACC Secretary on December 22. The fate of the on-trial corruption cases was thrown into uncertainty immediately after dissolution

of Bac on November 21 with the

formation of the commission. Uncertainty loomed over the fate of 1.107 Bac staff due to the ongoing debate about whether they would be absorbed in the commission.

On taking office on November 23, ACC Chairman Justice Sultan Hossain Khan declared them as ACC staffs, saying a screening would be conducted later to finalise who

would continue in the commission. But the government, on January 3, ordered them not to work with the




