

Naga rebels to hold talks with Delhi soon

Government negotiators and northeastern separatists are expected to meet later this month for talks on ending India's longest-running insurgency, a rebel spokesman said yesterday.

"We expect the talks to be held at the month-end and issues pertaining to integration of all Nagainhabited areas in the northeast will be discussed," said V.S. Atem, a senior leader of the Isak-Muivah faction of the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN).

Final dates for the talks in New Delhi are yet to be finalized. The two sides entered into ceasefire in 1997 in Nagaland.

India seeks solutions to row with Pakistan, China

Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh said Wednesday he wants "outof-the-box" solutions to settle his country's long running disputes with neighbours Pakistan and China.

Singh told a meeting organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), India had to forge strategic relationships with the world, including Pakistan and China. We must move away from

incrementalisation to seeking outof-the-box solutions to the challenges we face," said Singh. "Whether it is the challenge of

development and political and social stability within South Asia or the challenge of stabilising our relations with Pakistan and China," he added.

"We must have the courage to question our assumptions and challenge preconceived notions. We must show a willingness to listen to others, even as we articulate our own concerns in a reasonable and convincing manner.

India has fought three wars with Pakistan and one with China. It fought a brief but bitter border war with China in 1962 that left their relations in shreds. But in recent years they have played down their territorial disputes to focus on improving commercial and other ties.

Both sides are presently engaged in discussions to resolve a lingering boundary dispute -- a result of the 1962 war -- with special representatives of India and China holding several rounds of talks since June

Lenders talk to LTTE as tensions mount

International lenders were in talks yesterday with Sri Lanka's Tamil Tiger rebels amid tensions between the guerrillas and the Colombo government over tsunami relief efforts.

The country directors of the Asian Development Bank, the World Bank and senior officers of the Japan Bank for International Cooperation were holding a series of meetings with the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), the World Bank said.

It said the talks with the LTTE's political wing leader S. P. Thamilselvan were part of their coordinated needs assessment for rebuilding the tsunami-affected parts of Sri Lanka".

"The team is expected to return

Thursday evening or early Friday after a number of meetings with the rebels," a World Bank official told

The government has said that it needs about three billion dollars for rebuilding affected areas, including the guerrilla-held areas of the island's north-east.

The latest meeting with the lenders came a day after the Tigers accused the military of threatening volunteers in relief centres managed by a Tiger affiliate, the Tamil Rehabilitation Organisation (TRO), in the island's east.

Pakistan has said it would not hold talks with India on resolving differences over the Baglihar hydropower project until New Delhi stopped work on it. It was essential that the work on

the project be stopped before any bilateral negotiations were held, Pakistan Foreign Office spokesman Masood Khan told state-run PTV
