ACUTE GAS CRISIS

Many BSCIC units cut production by 70-80pc

The ongoing gas crisis has forced many factories in the Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation (BSCIC) estate in Tongi to cut production by up to 80 percent.

The gas-run factories in the Tongi BSCIC area have been facing the shortage of gas for the last six months. But with the coming of winter the problem has been com-

pounded, as there is a huge shortfall in production of gas against the increasing demand.

The spiralling cost of production due to the gas crisis had forced many of the factory owners to cut production by 70 to 80 percent.

Factory officials in Tongi BSCIC area alleged that they had informed the Titus Gas Limited of their crisis several times but to no effect.

Some factories in the area have already suspended their production

while some are considering suspending the production.

"We cannot pay our workers wages regularly as we had to cut our production by 70 percent," said Abul Hossain, factory manager of National Glass Industry.

"For the last two weeks, there has virtually been no supply of gas other than on Fridays," said Abul Hossain.

Currently the gas supply has dropped to two pounds per square

Palestinian militants defy Abbas

6 Israelis among 9 killed in bombing, attack in Gaza

Palestinian militants killed six Israelis in a bombing and shooting attack at the main commercial crossing into Gaza, mounting their strongest challenge yet to President-elect Mahmoud Abbas and his call for non-violence.

Israeli troops killed three gunmen in an ensuing exchange of fire at the Karmi border terminal between Israel and Gaza, the army said. Militants said the men blew themselves up after infiltrating the heavily guarded compound late on Thursday.

Three militant groups claimed the attack: Hamas, the Popular Resistance Committees and al-Aqsa Martyrs Brigades, an armed wing of Abbas's Fatah movement.

"We will continue to chase you and disrupt your sleep until you leave the land you occupied," the groups said in a statement on Friday. "(The attack) affirms the consensus of the resistance factions on the choice of jihad (holy struggle)."

Hours after the incident, there was no comment from Abbas, while Israel signaled it would weigh its response to the operation carefully to avoid weakening a leader it has said it could do business with after years of shunning Yasser Arafat.


Chittagong Rab soon.

European space probe makes call from Titan

The European-built space probe Huygens entered the atmosphere of Saturn's largest moon, Titan, yesterday in the last lap of a historic voyage to unveil the secrets of the moon's fog-shrouded surface.

Huygens began its two-hour descent to Titan's surface at about 2 a.m. PST (5 a.m. EST), aided by a parachute, and began

monitor at the Space Operations Center.

"There is a signal coming back from Titan," ESA scientist John Dowsdworth said. "This is a tremendously exciting moment."

Dowsdworth said the probe at that point was "busy taking data" about 37.3 miles above the moon's surface.

"It looks like we heard the baby crying," mission manager Jean-Pierre LeBreton said. "It tells us that the probe is alive. The entry is successful and we are on the parachute."

Scientists believe the organic chemical reactions taking place on Titan resemble the processes that gave rise to life on Earth 4 billion years ago. Its atmosphere is mostly nitrogen, like Earth's, but its surface temperatures of about minus 292 F make it inhospitable to life.

The saucer-shaped probe was designed to rotate on its way down, snapping the first-ever high-definition, panoramic images of Titan's thick, smoggy atmosphere and its landscape.

Along with its six scientific instruments that measure the components of Titan's atmosphere, Huygens carries a sound


