Govt-backed criminals killing popular AL leaders

Speakers tell protest rally

Speakers at a rally yesterday said the criminals backed by four-party alliance government have been killing the popular and meritorious leaders of Awami League (AL) to secure their victory in the next general election.

They said if the government had taken action against the culprits who made an abortive attempt to assassinate Opposition Leader and AL President Sheikh Hasina in Dhaka, the killings in Habiganj could have been avoided.

The rally was organised by Dhaka City AL at Bangabandhu Avenue yesterday to protest the killing of former finance minister Shah AMS Kibria and four other AL leaders in Habiganj in a grenade attack on Thursday.

"The culprits are not nabbed as the government is backing them. So the government must be ousted soon to ensure the life of AL leaders," said Abdur Razzak, a presidium member and former minister.

Begum Motia Chowdhury, another presidium member and former minister, said the government has no right to remain in power any more and asked all to join the oust government movement.

"The present government wants to rule the country for another tenure and as such they are killing all meritorious leaders of AL across the country to make it weaker," she added.

Tofail Ahmed accused the government of playing with bloods, and said the AL with its long tradition of movement will soon be able to oust the government.

Dr Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir

blamed the government-backed criminals for Habiganj killing and said it has become obligatory for all to remove the government.

Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya, general secretary of the city AL, said they would enforce hartal repeatedly to unseat the government.

Presided over by the city AL President Md Omar Ali, the rally was also addressed by Mirza Azam MP, President of Krishak League Mirza Jalil, former lawmaker Haji Md Selim, and President of Bangladesh Mahila Awami League Ashraf-unnessa Mosharraf.

After the rally, a procession was brought out.

Bangladeshi farmer shot, 2 others abducted by BSF

A Bangladeshi farmer was injured seriously after the Indian Border Security Force (BSF) opened fire on him on Char Mazardia border under Paba upazila of the district yesterday.

The injured was identified as Abdul Jalil, 38. He was undergoing treatment at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital with bullet injuries

in his leg.

Two other Bangladeshi farmers were abducted by the BSF personnel from the same spot. One of them was identified as Golam Rabbani, 35, son of late Khoda Boksha Mondal of the same village.

BDR quoting witnesses said a BSF team from Kaharpara outpost suddenly entered about 150 yards inside the Bangladesh territory in

Char Mazardia area and opened fire on the farmers without any provocation at about 10:30am.

The BSF also abducted two other farmers while they were working on their land and took them to their camp.

Local BDR personnel immediately rushed to the spot and sent a protest letter to their Indian counterpart in this regard.

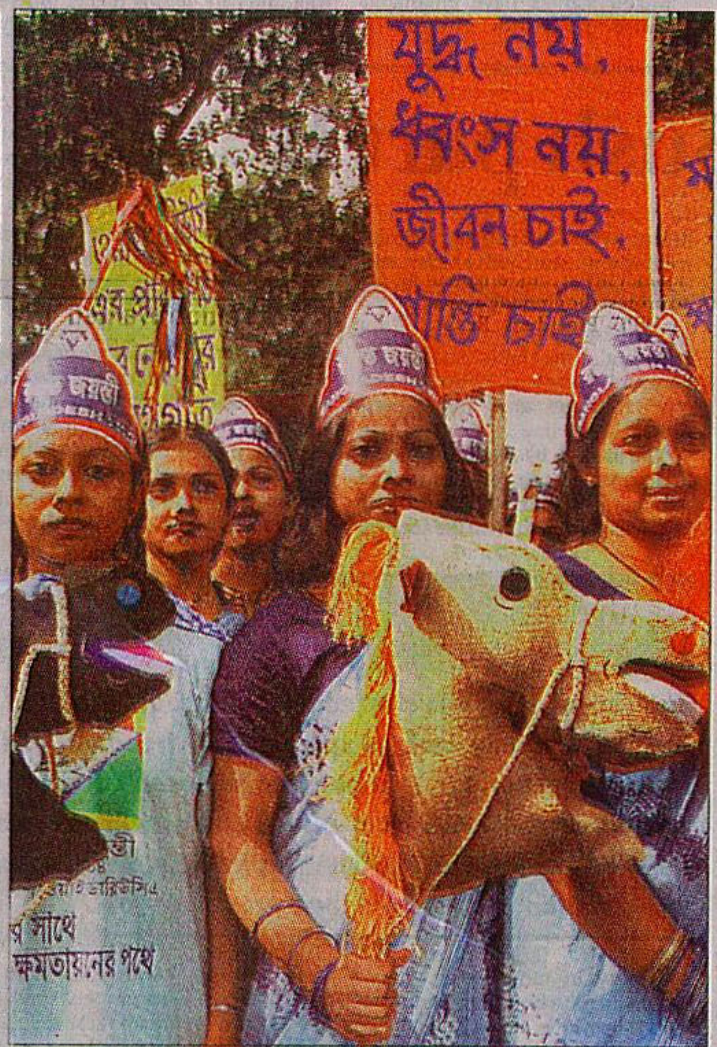
SAARC SUMMIT 3 BNP confces postponed
