The US military said three Iraqi soldiers and five civilians were killed and seven people were wounded in the attack. No Americans were among the casualties.

The bombing came shortly after insurgents mounted a rocket attack against an Iraqi army base in the town of Duluiya, north of Baghdad, killing three soldiers and wounding four, security sources said.

The bodies of three Iraqi contractors were found shot dead in the town of Balad, north of Baghdad, police said. The men had been abducted a week earlier.

US troops killed two Iragis in a car near the western city of Ramadi, according to witnesses. The circumstances were not immediately

The Iraqi authorities shut down Baghdad international airport and closed its land borders for three days, in a bid to control the country for Sunday's general elections, the first since former dictator Saddam Hussein was toppled in April 2003.

A dusk-to-dawn curfew was also slapped on most of the country and vehicle restrictions were enforced, as security and police urged residents in Iraq's danger spots to stay at home until election day.

Despite the war-like atmosphere of blast walls, razor wire and rattling army vehicles patroling the empty street, many Iraqis were upbeat about choosing a national assembly that could change the course of the country's history.

A Pay Commission meeting on Thursday finalised the report. The recommended pay structure puts the highest basic pay at Tk 27,500 and the lowest at Tk 2,800, said sources.

Since the last pay structure was announced in 1997, there had been an inflation of 31.76 percent, observed the commission in its report. In line with the inflation, it recommended a pay hike of 70 percent on an average.

There is, however, no guarantee that the government would fully implement the Pay Commission recommendations. The 1997 Pay Commission had put the highest and lowest basic pay at Tk 18,000 and Tk 1,850 but the government scaled it down to Tk 15000 and Tk 1500.

If the Pay Commission's recomnew pay, which will be effected from January 1,2005, would cost the governmentTk5,294 crore annually.
