"There are numerous mementoes like stamps and first day covers that were introduced after independence but we can not put them on display due to the lack of space," said Ahsanullah, supervisor of Postal Museum. He added that those items were kept in steel cabinets. "The authorities tried to start the museum by exhibiting old and exotic souvenirs thinking that would attract more visitors," added Ahsanullah.

The museum has postage stamps from around 98 countries under the Postal Union.


Inaugurated on January 30, 1985, the museum on an average gets about ten visitors a day. It is open everyday except on Fridays. No entrance fee is charged.

"We do not want to earn any revenue from it but just want to continue displaying the items," said the supervisor. He said the museum does not get any funds from the government or the private


He informed that the authorities were thinking of making more space for the museum.

"May be there will be a bigger building where the museum can be shifted from this office of the post master



Wasa initiative to check theft of manhole covers

Dhaka Water and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) is replacing the existing easily recyclable leadmade manhole covers with 'spheroidized' covers in order to check theft.

The spheroidized covers are made of high-carbon steel. As this metal cannot be recycled easily, it will discourage the manhole cover thieves, Wasa officials said. The Wasa has already re-

placed 18 manhole covers with the new ones.

According to Wasa, the price of each lead manhole cover is around Tk 3,000. But the news ones cost Tk 12,000 each. It will cost over Tk 43 crore to replace all the covers.

The theft of manhole cover is a regular phenomenon as lead is a recyclable material. The thieves sell them to hardware stores and workshops who use those to make other objects.
