

ULTURAL FEAS Down memory lane

"TV plays should deal with contemporary reality"

ROMINENT TV play director AtiquI Hague Chowdhury has chosen to adopt a low profile for the last nine months due health. However, his TV serial Dr Mahataber Swapno, made earlier, is airing on Channel-i. Recently, Atiq took time to speak to The Daily Star about his life and times. Excerpts:

What is your impression about current plays telecast from different private channels? Atiq has a ready answer: "Some are really good, some tolerable, others not worth viewing at all. I admit there may be romantic and witty plays but they should depict real life in a reasonable and acceptable manner. Some of our young writers and directors are successful in bringing a touch of reality to our current TV plays." However, Atiq bemoans the growing

commercialisation of package plays and the tendency of a few profit-earning sponsors to treat TV plays purely as a source of entertainment or an industry. As he says: "I believe TV plays should deal with people and their ideas. There should be a naturalistic touch and internal conflicts of characters should come to the fore. TV plays should deal with contemporary reality; at the same time the message should have a universal and poetic quality. I strongly feel that if there is a crisis of scripts, more plays based on the classics of world literature should be made."

Atiq certainly practices what he preaches -with good results. For his contribution in TV plays Atiq got the Best TV Producer Award in 1976. Moreover, he has twice over been the recipient of the Sequence of Merit Award provided by the Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy. He has also received an honorary

Doctorate degree provided by New Delhi-based World Development Council in 1990 for his contribution to TV plays. Atiq is also a prominent TV playwright. He delves into subjects such as romance, society, politics and family relationships. Atig says, "The aim of TV plays should be an authentic portrayal of life. The interrelationship between human beings, political ideology or philosophy, in fact the whole society, should come forth in TV plays."

Atiq is full of praise for the package drama trend in Bangladesh. He says, "Package drama was introduced in Bangladesh Television and I was the first director of a play. Following the introduction of package drama, many talented playwrights, directors, artistes and technical crews have had the opportunity to prove their

Atiq has had a long and distinguished career. He began as a producer at the Pakistan radio in the early 1960s. From then on he has produced hundreds of radio plays. Of those Srikanto, Shesher Kabita, Pather Dabi and others have gained popularity. Atiq says, "Many prominent drama personalities of the country like Abdullah Al Mamun, Ferdausi Majumdar, Khalil and others were introduced as radio drama artistes in the plays produced by me.

Later in 1967, Atig joined the then Pakistan Television. Till 1997, Atiq had been regular in producing, writing and directing television plays. this role he has earned recognition as the 'promoter of TV stars'. Atiq says, "Artistes Abul Hayat, Humayun Faridy, Shampa Reza and others were introduced in TV plays produced by

Adds Atiq, "If it is a quality play, the artistes get the scope to express their talent under the guidance of a good director. In fact, it is the director who creates artistes. In the early 1980s, TV plays were based on one or two characters. The directors as well as the artistes had plenty of time for teamwork, which is very important for a quality play. That is why the artistes got tremendous exposure, which is very rare these days--even though many plays are being aired in a range of TV channels. Nevertheless, I believe that there are still many latent talents in our country.'



"Angling is fun on rainy days"

Shubhrodev, a popular singer, has many hit albums to his credit: Hamlyner Banshiwala, Je Banshi Niye Gechhey, Shesh Chithi and the latest. Lolita. He also acted in some television plays and appeared in many hit music videos and television commercials. He talks to The Daily Star on a mix of issues:

Any nickname?

Although I am known as Shubhro, my actual name is

Are you a morning person?

Yes, I am. I usually get up early and concentrate in my routine rewaz. I do a little warm up exercise and, most importantly, I say my prayers in the morning which is a

Are you involved in social work?

I work with the Acid Survivors Association. I wrote and composed the theme song for these acid victims Shat Manush Kakhono Acid Chhorey Na (An honest person never throws acid on another person) which was telecast on BBC television in 2000. And I performed in a good number of charitable programmes for under privileged and disabled children. My first concert was a charitable one in 1991 after a cyclone hit the coastal areas of Bangladesh. The concert was held in Dublin, What do you think about remix or remake songs?

Among all those remake and remix songs. I think about 5 percent are noteworthy. The rest are nothing but trash. This is quite irritating. If one is interested in remaking a song the artiste must have a proper musical sense. Otherwise the total effort becomes a pain.

Interesting experience



In 2000 I attended the Bollywood Music Award function where I performed a Bangla song "Tirish Lakh Praner Binimoye" in front of a huge audience. About 25 popular and talented Indian artistes such as AR Rahman, Lucky Ali, Shyamak, Rubi Bhatia and others were also present. It was a pleasant experience for me to sing in Bangla and being complimented by senior artistes later

What was your breakthrough performance? My first album Hamiliner Banshiwala was a massive hit.

And all my albums, including Je Banshi Niye Gechhey, Shesh Chithi and my latest one Lolita were also major hits. I shot the first Bangladeshi music video abroad and the first Bangla video on satellite television was also mine. I have so many hits that it is hard to tell which one was the breakthrough. I had a wish to sing pure folk songs, which was fulfilled very recently. In my last album I have compiled some unsung folk songs that remained untouched for years. It was a dream-come-true to me.

Which season do you like most and why? I just love the rainy season. I usually go for angling on

rainy days. As a young boy, when I lived in Sylhet, I loved to listen to the sound of raindrops on our corrugated iron roof. I think there is nothing so appealing as this.

What is your most treasured possession? I think it is my voice.

Your greatest regret?

In 1988 I appeared in a television play for the first time in my life. It was a drama serial titled "Shuktara". On that day, hundreds of students of Jagannath Hall of Dhaka University gathered in their television room to watch my performance. But unfortunately the roof of the building collapsed and many students died. This incident remains etched in my memory. After all they died only because they had opted to watch my performance.

Patha natak festival begins today

Month-long theatre festival ahead

Good news for theatre enthusiasts. An eight-day patha natak (street drama) festival starts today at two venues: Central Shaheed Minar premises and Rabindra Sarobar near Dhanmondi Lake. The Bangladesh Group Theatre Federation (BGTF), in association with Bengal Foundation, has arranged the festival. Eminent educationist Sardar Fazlul Karim will inaugurate the festival today at the Central Shaheed Minar premises.

Aktaruzzaman, programme secretary of BGTF, said, "Each year BGTF arranges a patha natak festivalespecially in the February-March season, as these two months have a significance in our national life Last year we arranged the festival in March to observe our Independence Day. This year we have arranged the festival in February to commemorate the Language martyrs. "45 theatre groups from all over

the country are taking part in the festival, of which 18 are from Dhaka.

A few prominent theatre groups of the country like Theatre (Baily Road), Aranyak Natya Dal, Mahakal Prachyanut, Samay Sanskritik Goshthi, and others will stage patha natak in the festival. Each day five plays will be staged at each of the venues. The duration of the street drama is less than 40 minutes.

On the forthcoming programmes of BGTF, Aktar said, Chittagong Division Council of BGTF will arrange the programme, which includes a 17-daylong drama festival, starting from February 12 at Shilpakala Academy in Chittagong. Theatre groups from all over Chittagong division will participate in

Aktar added that, following a discussion between the leaders of BGTF and Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy, the former has plans to arrange a month-long theatre festival at the newly built National Theatre Stage. Going by the favourable turn out at its Experimental Theatre Stage, these initiatives of BGTF seem set for success.

In aid of AIDS and Tsunami victims "We Are the World" returns to the centre stage

We Are the World, the pioneering all-star charity anthem that generated millions of dollars for African famine relief 20 years ago, is returning to the world stage--this time to raise money for AIDS and tsunami The group USA For Africa reissued the

Grammy-winning single recorded by more than 40 superstars--among them Bruce Springsteen, Ray Charles, Diana Ross, Bob Dylan, Bette Midler, Willie Nelson, Michael Jackson and Stevie Wonder--on January 31, as part of a two-disc DVD set. The original single and accompanying

album have raised more than \$60 million since their 1985 release to help combat hunger in Africa. Proceeds from the upcoming reissue will again be earmarked for famine relief, as well as for AIDS treatment and prevention, plus disaster recovery in areas of East Africa devastated by the recent tsunamis, organisers said. The double-disc set features four hours

of footage from the landmark We Are the World recording session, which began late

famine victims, Belafonte contacted leading entertainment manager Ken Kragen for help enlisting stars to record a song whose royalties would go exclusively to relieve Africa's food crisis. There were no artist or agent fees

After "Indian Idol", it's time for "Nepal Star" contest's website, www.nepalstaronline.com

What with the stupendous success of American Idol and Indian Idol, now it's time for Nepal to join the fray. Nepalese living in the kingdom and even outside are set to hit a high note at "Nepal Star", the nation-wide contest in which viewers will choose the next singing sensation in the country.

'Nepal Star" is being organised by Nepal One, the Indian TV channel headed by Nalini Singh, with Nepal Lever's Lux beauty soap being the main sponsor. The two-year-old channel in Nepalese says it is scouting for latent talent especially in the "underprivileged segment of society" who otherwise would have very little chance of getting exposure.

The Nepalese have music in their blood, says Nina, coordinator of "Nepal Star."

"Walk into any school, college or office and say you want to organise a concert and five people will immediately stand up to volunteer. There is immense musical talent here but probably because they have been living with it, people here are not so conscious of it. But to outsiders like us, it is a revelation." Less than a week after the contest was

announced, applications started pouring in from all over Nepal and outside as well. There are over 2.000 applications already and some of them sent by Nepalese living in India, Britain, the Middle East, Thailand and Hong Kong.

The auditions start Monday. The first round will be held in Biratnagar in the south, near the Indian border, the second in Pokhara in western Nepa and the third in Kathmandu.

The winner gets music contracts and a Bollywood offer but Nina is not divulging the details immediately. "The winner gets to cut a CD which Nepal One will help market," she says. "The recording company is based in Nepal since we want to promote Nepal, However, Bollywood is there since that is the ultimate aspiration level for all performers.

The prize might not seem as glittering as the contract worth Rs.10 million with Sony Entertainment that "Indian Idol" is offering along with a recording contract with a major Indian music label but it is definitely a step towards stardom for aspirants in the poverty and insurgency-hit country.

Besides, "Nepal Star" is also open to the visually impaired contestants, in keeping with Nepal One's employment policy.

In 2005, Nepal One is gearing up to launch many more events, including musical programmes, Nina said.
