

Outlaw killed in 'crossfire'

Surrounded by police, the GMF cadres opened fire on the law-enforcers. Police said they fired back and Tipul fell in the line of fire. Others escaped after the gunfight that lasted about half an hour, they added.

Assistant Sub-Inspector Nasir and constables Firoz and Sattar were wounded, claimed police, who seized two pipe-guns and six bullets from the spot.

Tipul, son of Manowar Hossain of Padamdi-Sreerampur village, was accused of eight criminal charges including four murders and two abductions, police said.

'AL, RAW plotted to kill Kibria, foil summit'

The ruling Bangladesh Nationalist Party's student wing yesterday accused Awami League (AL) and India of killing former finance minister SAMS Kibria.

From a rally held under the banner of 'Stop Propaganda against Bangladesh', Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) leaders said AL chief Sheikh Hasina and India's external intelligence agency Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) killed Kibria as part of a plot to foil the 13th Saarc Summit with an intent to tarnish the country's image.

The rally held at Aparajeyo Bangla on Dhaka University campus followed a procession brought out from the Madhu's Canteen.

Addressing the rally, the JCD leaders accused Hasina of running a propaganda campaign against Bangladesh both at home and abroad. JCD President Azizul Bari Helal said due to a close relationship with India, she had convinced the Indian prime minister not to join the Saarc Summit.

JCD General Secretary Shaiful Bari Babu said Hasina has long been involved in conspiring against

the country. Now she is trying to cause anarchy in the country at the expense even of her own party men.

She (Hasina) portrays Bangladesh as a country of anarchy and instability so that she could win sympathy of the world leaders, Babu said adding that if the US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) carry out a thorough and impartial search in Sudha Sadan, the AL president's Dhanmondi residence, everything would come out clear.

AL's student wing Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) yesterday brought out a pro-hartal procession on the campus at about 6:30am in the morning. They held a rally after police had stopped the procession at the entrance to Arts Building.

Blaming the BNP-Jamaat-led coalition for 'slaying AL leaders and activists' across the country, BCL President Liqat Sikder demanded immediate resignation of the government.

Meanwhile a JCD source said they would beat up BCL leaders and activists if they try to bring out processes

on the campus. A number of students residing in different DU dormitories yesterday alleged that hall units JCD leaders had forced them to join the JCD procession.

Gradual drying up of vast wetlands with infrastructural expansions in marshy lands exposes deltaic Bangladesh to immense economic and ecological losses posing a threat to sources of livelihood as well as culture, experts said in the city on Wednesday.

Speaking at a seminar to mark the 'World Wetlands Day' they also discussed the state pollution, declining trend of water level, loss of fisheries in the drying up process. They also highlighted the importance of wetlands in terms of economy and ecology in low lying countries like Bangladesh.

"We have undertaken a series of initiatives to protect the wetlands with Tangar Haor being a major success story," State Minister for

Environment and Forest Jafrul Islam Chowdhury told the seminar.

Jafurul said major initiative was underway to protect and enrich the Asia's largest Hakaluki Haor with GEF fund to safeguard a marshy



A total of 546 employees, who were appointed controversially by the Rajshahi University (RU) authorities last year, have called a strike on February 7 demanding confirmation of their jobs.

They will also stage a demonstration and sit-in on the campus on the day.

The employees have also threatened to enforce an indefinite strike if their jobs were not confirmed by the date and they would cut off electricity and water lines of university officials.

The programmes were announced after they staged demonstrations and put administrative building under lock and key for one hour on Wednesday.

They also assaulted RU Pro-vice-chancellor and Chairman of the

appointment committee Prof KAM Shahadat Hossain Mondol when he rushed to the scene after hearing a

chao.

The employees held a rally presided over by Rafiqul Islam Sadar, convenor of the Newly Recruited Employees' Interest Preservation Committee.

"RU authorities have always used us against general students who were on movement for security," said Joint Convenor Akkas Ahmed.

The employees also staged one-hour sit-in in front of the administrative building.

The pro-VC said their demands are under consideration.

The High Court stayed the recruitment following a suit by Abu Aslam, a lawyer, last year.
